Above the desk in his study William E. Olds always had a motto which bore this inscription: "Nothing worth while was ever achieved without enthusiasm." 1863-1928

Wilbur P. Bowen was born July 28, 1863 and died September 5, 1928. For forty years his name has been identified with Physical Education, having won national recognition by his leadership and writings in this field. When in 1894 a Department of Physical Education was created at the Michigan State Normal College, he was named as the director and held that position up to the time of his death. It is due to his untiring efforts that the department now enjoys a place of leadership in the training of physical educators.

Professor Bowen was a true teacher, placing service and genuine helpfulness above material gain. A man of fine personality, quiet and reserved yet forceful, modest and unassuming yet stimulating, he won for himself the admiration, respect and affection of students and associates.

In the passing of Professor Bowen, the faculty of the Normal College lost a worthy member, the student body and alumni a great teacher and friend, and the field of Physical Education a leader of rare attainments.

Now it befell in the year of Our Lord 1929, and in the reign of President Hoover, the year I, that there prepared for graduation a group of two hundred and twenty-one students in the Michigan State Normal College, at the fair town of Ypsilanti. And of this class the members were very studious and grave, so that their professors had great joy therein and were both sad and loath to see these students depart. But the time of their work was completed, and they must needs seek other fields for study and adventure. That their name might not be forgotten nor their deeds be unrecorded, they did order to be written here all the things of note that have been seen of them, and all the things they have done in their four years of education—of which classes are a minor part. But that our books have not been neglected is shown in this—that of our number eight are Stoics and eighteen belong to Kappa Delta Pi.

In our Freshman year we were first initiated into that whirlwind called an Alumni Building Fund Campaign, (that was before the days of painless extraction), and into

We suffered alternately of homesickness, cold feet and spring fever. And with the spring we discovered River Brink, that extra-scholastic resort where many hours of wisdom are gained in one. We learned to watch the bulletin boards for announcements, to say on Wednesday morning, "Meet me at the picture," to sit quietly through the assembly hour and to slip away unnoticed if the speaker had poor terminal facilities. We attended the Co-ed prom in appropriate attire, and we rocked with mirth at our first college comedy. Then we went home to think things over.

Our Sophomore year found us bolder and brighter. We plucked up our courage with both hands and ventured to join an organization or two. Now and then we went to one of the Kresge Balls. Later in the year we took part in that bravest of all ventures—marking our professors.

In our Junior year we beheld the seventy-fifth Anniversary of the founding of our Alma Mater with a wondrous pageant accompanying the Mid-Winter Conference. That year we grew and expanded in activities though we decreased in numbers. It is quality and not quantity that counts.

Our return in the fall of our fourth year found us fittingly grave and dignified. We duly made our pilgrimage to see Uncle Demetrius up beyond the Water Tower. But alas, that gentleman shortly went into retirement to await the removal of the unsightly rubrication of his physiognomy.

Among the highlights of our career may be counted the hours that we have spent in the main corridor selling candy, apples, flowers, tickets for banquets, Auroras, lectures, concerts, shows. The sad part of our last year is that, while we have the inconvenience of walking around the block to the Science Hall, we will never have the benefits of the new Library. Still the old Library is full of memories—of trysts and whispers, of work and worry and waiting—that we would not part with. But our parting word is of the new Library—you who follow us, you who use the building that arrives as we depart, use it well; persevere as we have done, and may you never hear, the day before a blue book, those oft-repeated words, "This book is in use at present."

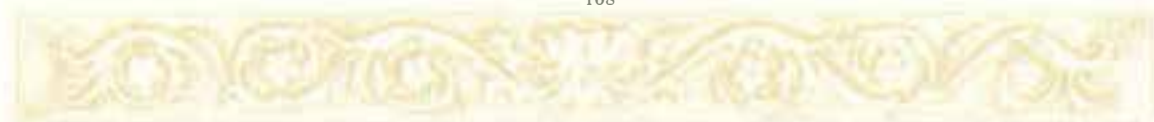


I V Y D A Y

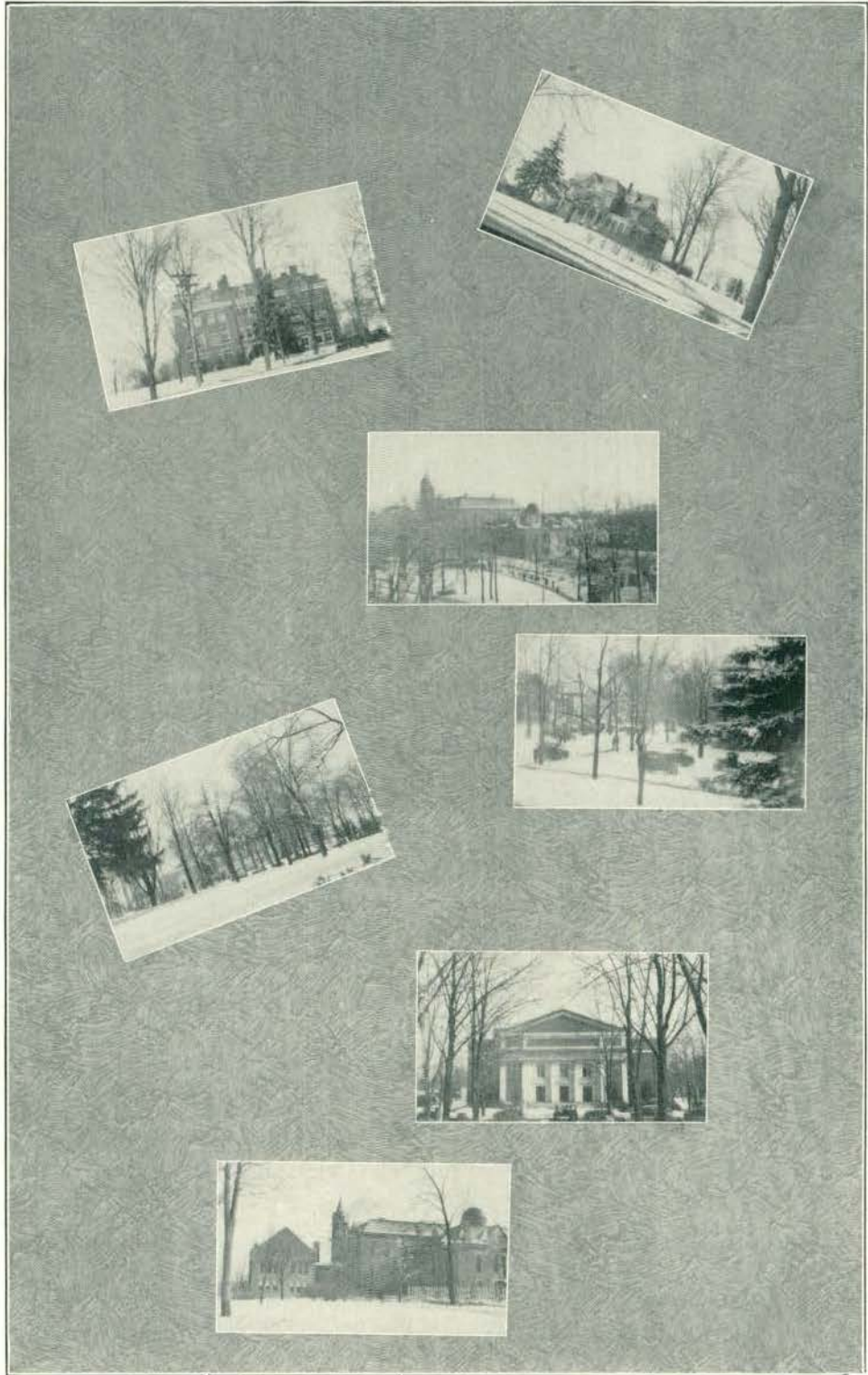

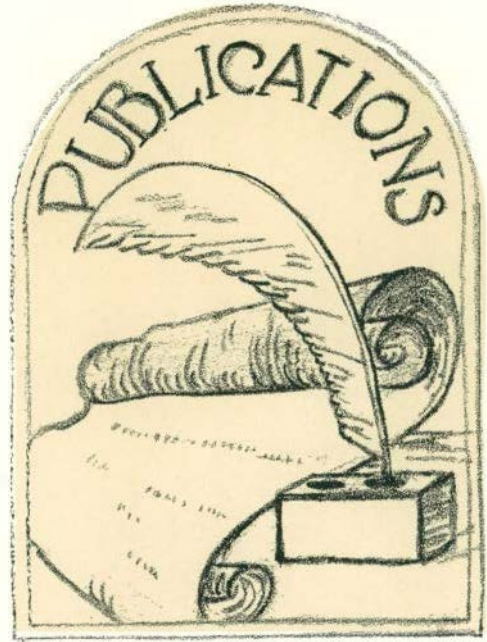

The exchange list has also been greatly built up, thus increasing the number of schools receiving news of the activities of the Michigan State Normal College.

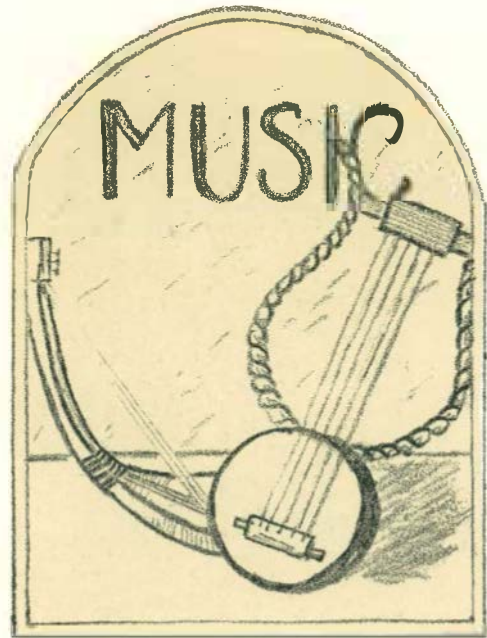

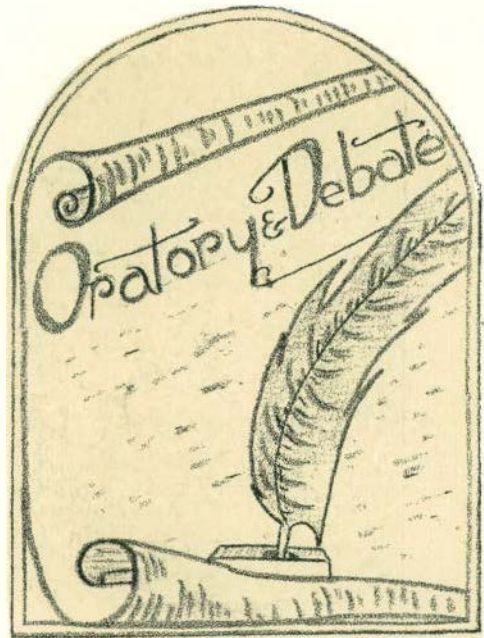

SPEECH ACTIVITIES

Professor F. B. McKay, director of Women's Debate and Oratory is enjoying a leave of absence in the Graduate College of the University of Michigan. Professor Harry T. Wood, director of Men's Debate, has been assisted this year by Mr. Paul Ward, a former M. S. N. C. debater, who has assisted with Men's Debate; and Mr. Elmen Winkelman, President of Pi Kappa Delta, who has assisted with Women's Debate.

Eighteen men and twelve women have been carrying forward the debate schedule and are now in the middle of an enjoyable and profitable season. The men are debating the question, "Resolved, that the jury system should be abolished," and have completed dual non-decision debates with Heidelberg College and the Detroit College of Law. The debate schedule includes contests with Hope College, Kalamazoo College, Olivet College, Western State Normal, and the University of Florida.

The women are discussing the question, "Resolved, that it is desirable that installment buying be drastically curtailed." Their schedule includes contests with Alma College, Albion College, Calvin College, Wheaton College, Wittenberg College, Olivet College, and Western State Normal.

Pi Kappa Delta, the honor forensic society has been somewhat handicapped this year by having only seven student members on the campus. The members have made up in effort what was lacking in numbers. Bi-weekly luncheons have been held at which plans for the "Province of the Lakes" Convention and Tournament of Pi Kappa Delta to be held in Ypsilanti, April 11 and 12, 1929, have been discussed. The local chapter sponsored a Forensic Mixer and Pep meeting at the beginning of the school year, and a Lincoln Party in Starkweather Hall, February 12.

Intercollegiate Forensic activities do not get under way until the latter part

of the school year and many speaking events occurred too late to appear in the 1928 AURORA. As such events should be recorded we have tried to include them under Speech Activities for this year.

The Michigan State Normal College was well represented at the National Convention of Pi Kappa Delta held at Heidelberg College, Tiffin, Ohio, April 3, 4, 5, and 6, 1928. Twelve students were entered in the various contests as follows: Elmen Winkelman, Clinton Fair, James Perdue, Charles Hill in Men's Debate; Frances Young, Mabel Parkhurst, Esther Dodge, and Evelyn Elliott in Women's Debate; Ira D. Kingsley and Alleen Gates in Oratory; and Elmen Winkelman and Bernice Dendel in Extemporaneous Speaking.

Bernice Dendel won special distinction for M. S. N. C. by placing third in the National Extemporaneous Speaking Contest of the Convention where 113 Colleges from 31 states were represented.

The State Peace Contest was won by Charles Hill of M. S. N. C. speaking upon the subject, "The Fundamentals of Peace." He was awarded first place and a cash prize of sixty dollars.

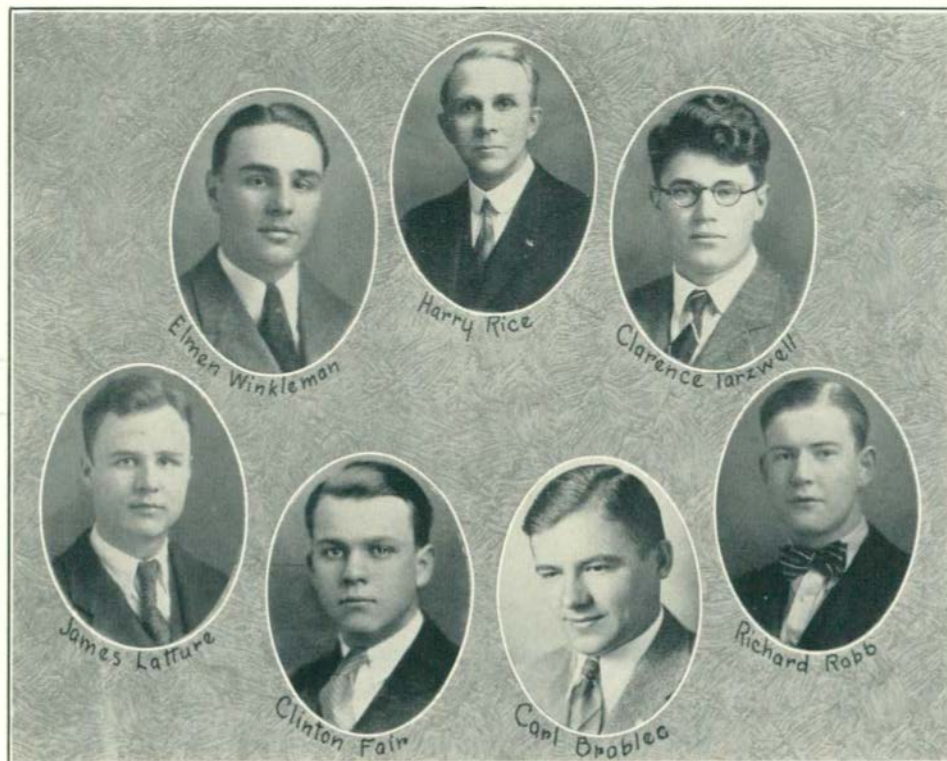
The Fourth Annual Michigan State Contest upon the Constitution was won by James D. Perdue of M. S. N. C. at Lansing, May 12, 1928. His subject was, "To Secure the Blessings of Liberty." He was the representative of the State of Michigan in the Interstate Contest held at Ohio State University, May 12, 1928.

Last year marked the First Annual Intercollegiate Interpretative Reading Contest between Bowling Green State Normal of Bowling Green, Ohio, and Michigan State Normal College. The M. S. N. C. contestants, Frances Young, Ruth Matheson and Reva Jarman, under the direction of Professor Marion Franklin Stowe won the contest, the first of its kind ever held in Michigan.

The Dramatic activities of the school are under the direction of Professor Lathers who last year was absent on leave. The last college play given in April, 1928, was directed by Professor F. L. Gilson. The play selected was Milne's delightful comedy "Mr. Pim Passes By."

During the 1928 summer school a group of players known as the J. Stuart Lathers players presented "An Intimate Stranger" and afterward made an extended and successful tour of Michigan playing in some twenty towns of the State.

During the present year several programs of one act plays have been presented by students in the speech department and at the present time plans are going forward for the selection of the cast for the All College play to be given in the spring term.

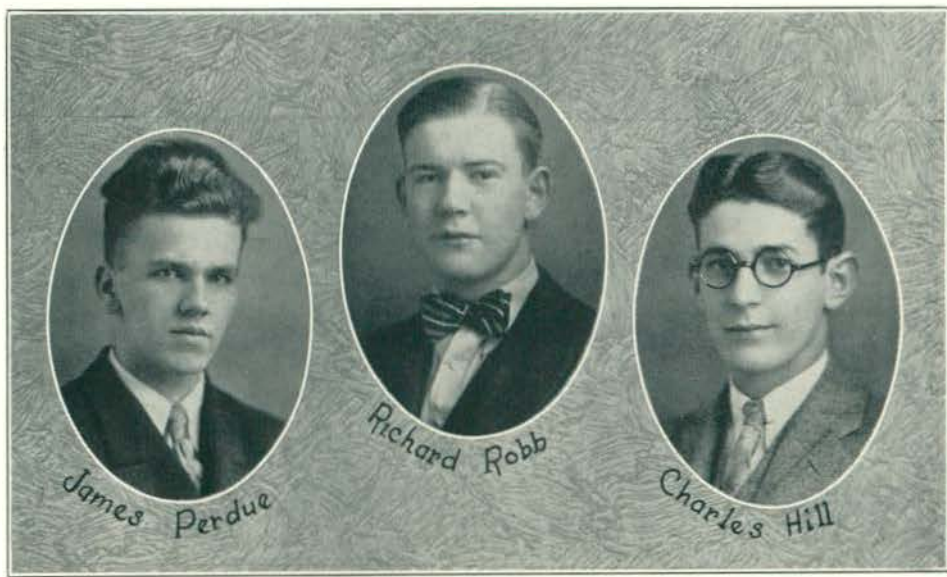

ORATORY

The Michigan State Normal College was well represented in the field of oratory during the season of 1927-28. The contests in which these orators participated came too late in the season to be recorded in the previous AURORA.

On April 3, 1928, Charles N. Hill, speaking on "The Fundamentals of Peace," won the State Collegiate Oratorical Contest for the promotion of Peace. In addition to representing the college well, indeed, Mr. Hill was given an award of sixty dollars.

James D. Perdue, speaking on the subject "To Secure the Blessings of Liberty," was entered in the State Collegiate Contest on the Constitution. Mr. Perdue won this contest and the consequent prize of seventy-five dollars and later represented our institution in the Interstate Contest on the Constitution at Ohio State University.

Richard Robb won the annual Freshman Oratorical Contest and received the college award of fifteen dollars.

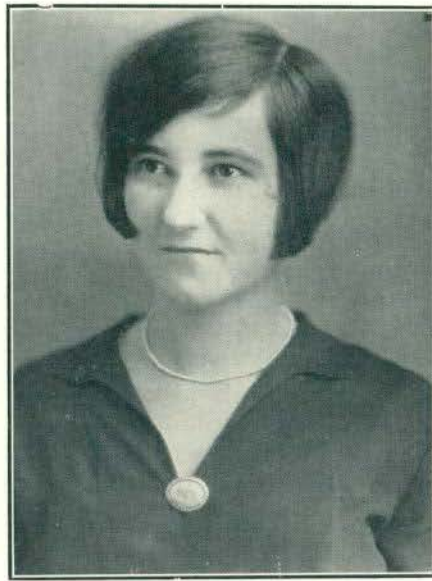

THE SHEEP OF PANURGE

It was Cap Night. Round and round the blazing bonfire leaped the yearlings. Panting, shuffling, perspiring. Mad Freshmen, wild Freshmen, delirious Freshmen, shrieking like bloodthirsty savages, drunk with the joy of abandon. Dirty, be-draggled, primitive, frenzied—round and round they swayed till they slumped exhausted in the dust.

A few embers hissed and spluttered. There was a momentary lull, the only moment of dignity and calm. Then they sang the college song; sang it blatantly and vigorously as only youth knows how. They joined hands, a sinuous snake dance winding in and out making a crazy line, yet strangely rhythmical. Down the main thoroughfare crawled that writhing reptile. Twisting, twining, wiggling in queer gymnastic contortions—"On with the dance."

Suddenly the rain fell. It came not in gentle caresses but in crushing torrents. Pandemonium broke loose. Stumbling, tumbling, pushing with one mighty onslaught they rushed the theatre. The class of '31 had upheld the college traditions. They made history that night. Next day the local newspaper, in describing the occasion, called the students a "flock of collegians." But old Tim Maloney the town Philosopher, called them a "flock of sheep."

The bulk of each generation, always and everywhere, is simply a flock of sheep. I turn back the pages of my History. It is dawn of July 14, 1789, a new day. All Paris is in the streets, rushing foaming like some wineglass into which poison has been dropped. It is the dusk of July 14, 1789. At every barricade there whirls a simmering pool of blood. But the Bastille is fallen.

It takes spectacular examples to drive the point home for us. The fact remains that Life has always been a game of "follow the leader." Only a few small voices have dared to question, and they have paid the price non-conformity always pays. We read with wonder of the storming of the Bastille. Those were horrible days, we say. We do not even dream that no age in history has been so dominated by the sheep-spirit as the one in which we are living today. The very newspaper you read, the language you speak with its slang, the movie you attend, the songs you sing are all manifestations of the sheep spirit.

WOODROW WILSON

A presidential inauguration is a picturesque affair. It is a brilliant affair when the sun shines bright and the air is balmy, as it was when Woodrow Wilson took the oath of office, delivered his inaugural address a few minutes later and before nightfall was at his desk transacting the business of the government.

Many things were expected of this strong, fine-featured man as he stood there in front of the White House reviewing the parade, and his followers were not to be disappointed. The closing words of his inaugural address were "I summon all honest men, all patriotic, all forward-looking men to my side. God helping me, I will not fail them, if they will but counsel and sustain me."

There is probably one thing that brought more enemies to Woodrow Wilson than anything else. His League of Nations, a tremendous conception, has set a formula (however much it needs correction) which is good for the old world, although the popular opinion is that it would be fatal for America. What America's place in world relationships should be, was once described by this eloquent tongue when President Wilson said, "A nation which neither sits in judgment upon others, nor is disturbed in her own counsels, but which keeps herself free and fit to do that which is honest and truly serviceable for the peace of the world."

It can never be said by anyone that Woodrow Wilson weakened one bit under the blows of his own party friends. When all was dark, with Wilson and the League defeated, the words of Ibsen may well be applied to this man: "The strongest man in the world is the man who stands alone."

Woodrow Wilson is dead. Our great war president has fallen on the field. He has fought a good fight; he has finished the course; he has kept the faith. As Secretary Stanton said at the death bed of Lincoln, "Now he belongs to the ages." Like the prophets of old he had abuse and adversity at the hands of his own generation, and the ideals for which he in the end gave up his life, were ridiculed and scorned; but unlike so many of the world's great leaders, he lived to see the foundation of his work firmly established. If war can by any means be avoided, if by any rational process, mankind can acquire the habit of peace and cooperation, it will be because the idealism and intelligence of Woodrow Wilson were placed upon the altar of sacrifice in the supreme cause.

So as the nations of the world stood with bowed heads over the passing of a great leader, they have this one solemn consolation, *that his work lives after him.*

High spots of the year are the initiation of new members, the Mid-year Conference at which a banquet is given for the alumni, and a trip to some point of interest in the spring.





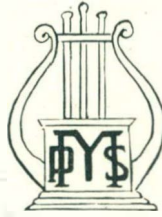

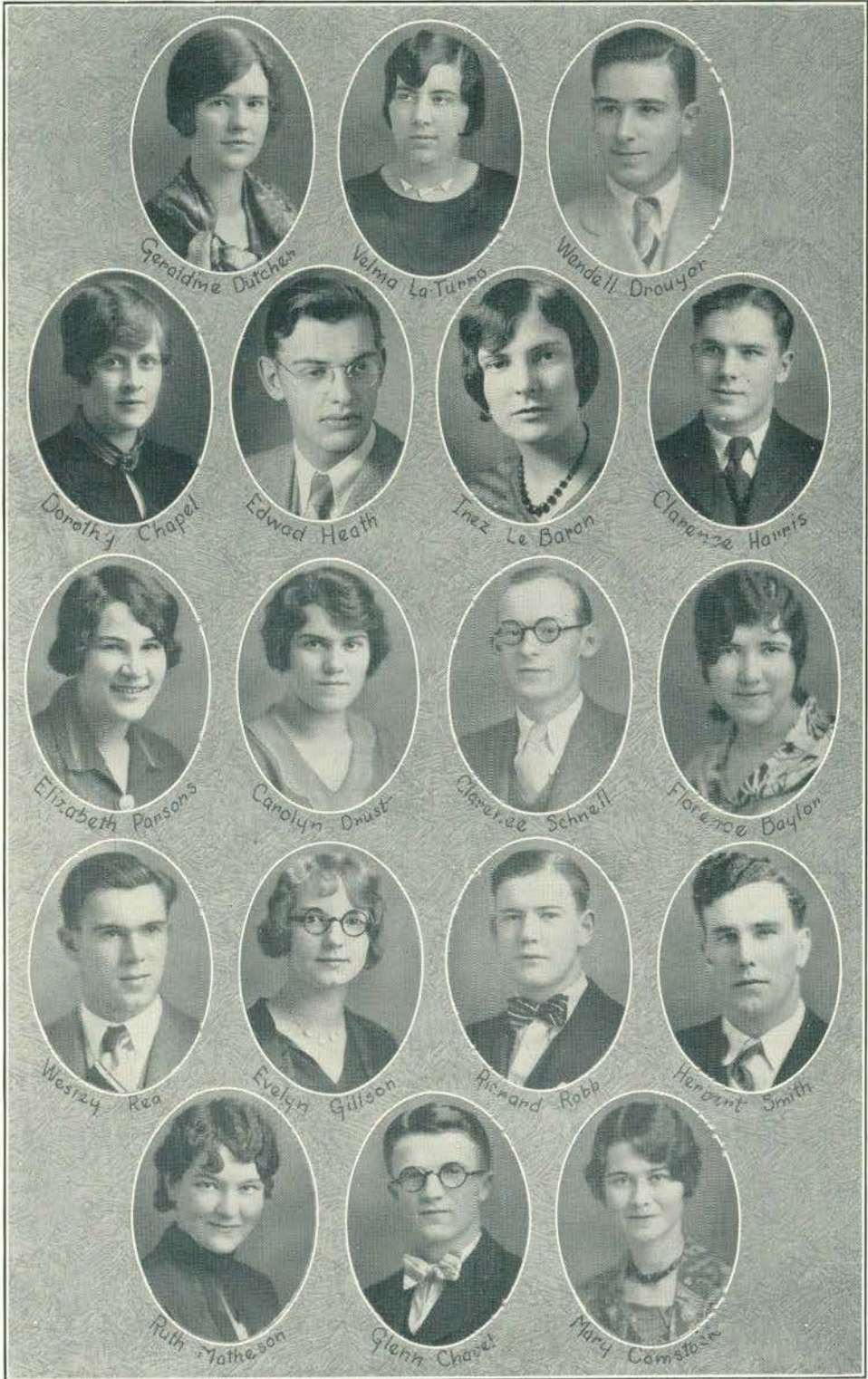
Although the Laonian Dramatic Society was founded primarily for the reading of plays, the club soon developed into a Little Theatre group, and presented plays for the public.

The official publication of the department is the "Javelin". It is published for the purpose of giving the alumni news of the department. Three issues of the "Javelin" are published during the school year.

In the fall term the club participated in an outdoor party. New faculty members of the department were introduced and a few short talks were given.

During the winter term a banquet was given in the gymnasium. Dr. Brownell, state director of Physical Education in Ohio, was the speaker. In his interesting address he stated that the whole school system, including the Physical Education department, should cooperate with the community for the advancement of that locality. He also remarked that the physical education directors should work with the other school departments and make it one of the most beneficial departments in the educational system. Dr. Brownell emphasized the need of physical education courses meeting the same criteria as general education.

In April, the club sponsored an informal dance at the Masonic Temple. It was a guest party which permitted one member of the couple to be a non-specializing physical education student.

The organization has voted to pay one hundred dollars for the erection of a tablet in honor of the late Professor Wilbur P. Bowen. The club has taken care of the expense of sending out the circular letter to the alumni concerning the Bowen Memorial Fund. The Physical Education Club will also send the president of the organization as representative to the Mid-West Physical Education Convention at Chicago, April 24th to 27th.

As this goes to press, the Physical Education Club is planning the usual good times for its members. A committee is busily engaged planning for a clogging contest. This is to be held in May and will be an all-college affair. In June the organization will sponsor another outdoor party for its members.

Kappa Delta Pi is an international honorary and professional fraternity in education, organized at the University of Illinois in 1909, and incorporated in 1911. The fraternity is composed of fifty-seven local chapters of over seven thousand members, and a Laureate Chapter having a membership of many nationally known educators.

Pi Chapter of Kappa Delta Pi, one of the two chapters now in Michigan was installed in June, 1922, with a charter membership of eighteen. At present there are fifty-one students and alumni and eighteen members of the faculty who claim active membership in the chapter. The other chapter is Beta Iota of Western State Teachers College at Kalamazoo, which was installed in 1929.

It is stated in the international constitution that the minimum qualifications for membership shall be: "Full Junior standing, general scholarship of a grade in the upper quartile of the institution, the indication that there will be continued interest in the field of education, and the manifestation of desirable social qualities."

It is further stated that: "The high purpose of Kappa Delta Pi shall be to encourage in its members a higher degree of consecration to social service in the field of education. To this end it shall maintain the highest educational ideals and foster fellowship, scholarship and achievement in educational work."

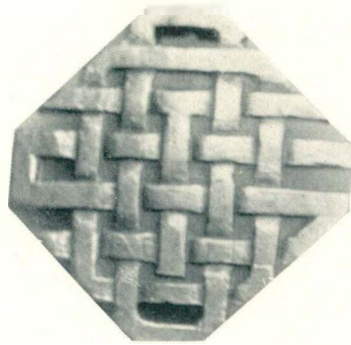

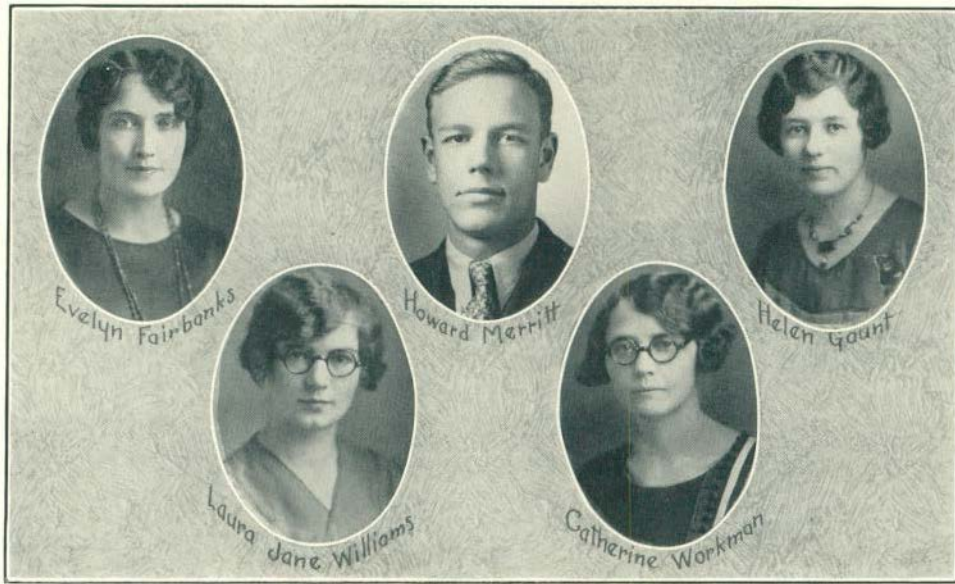

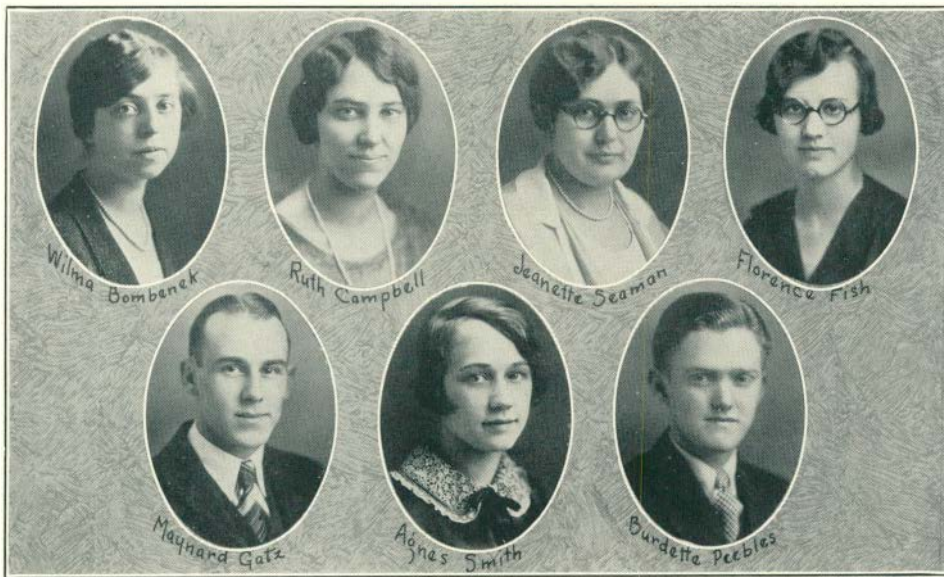
THE NEWMAN CLUB

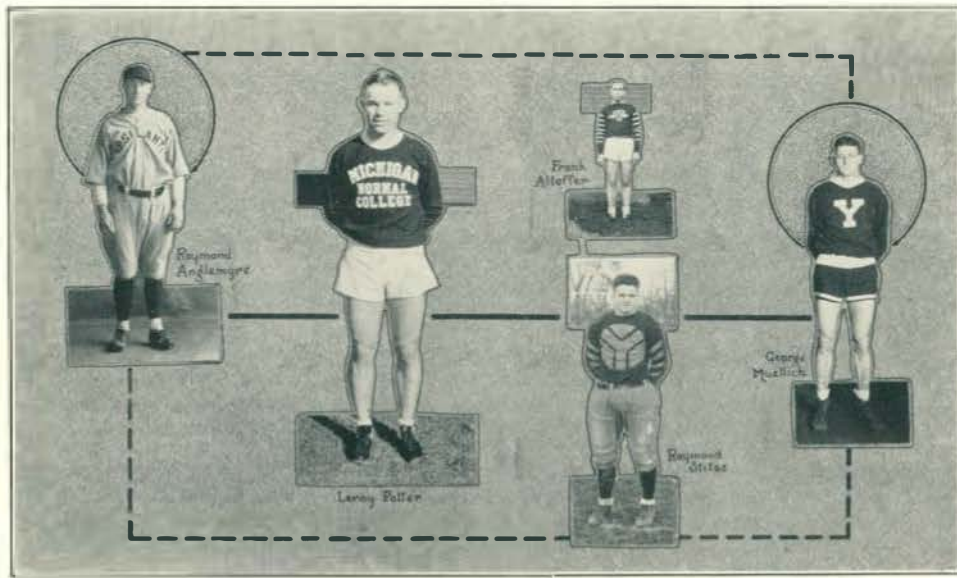


COACHES

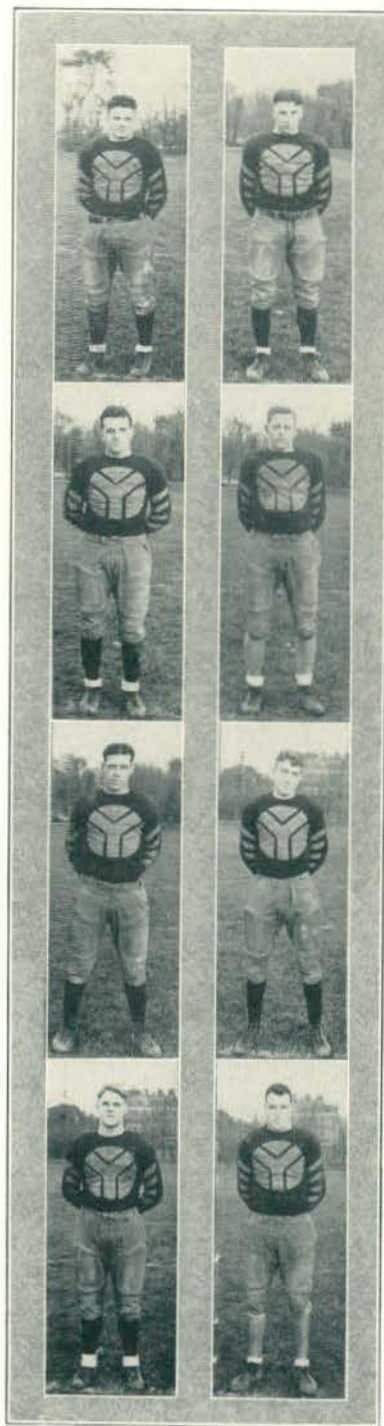

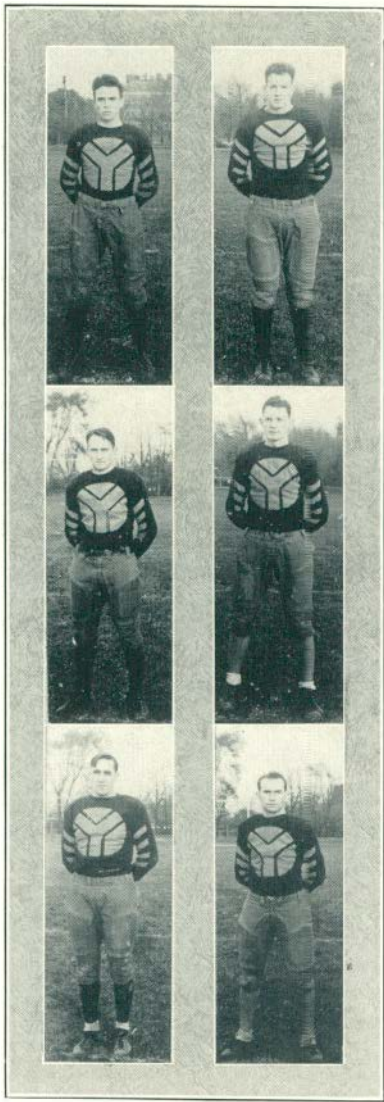

FOOTBALL

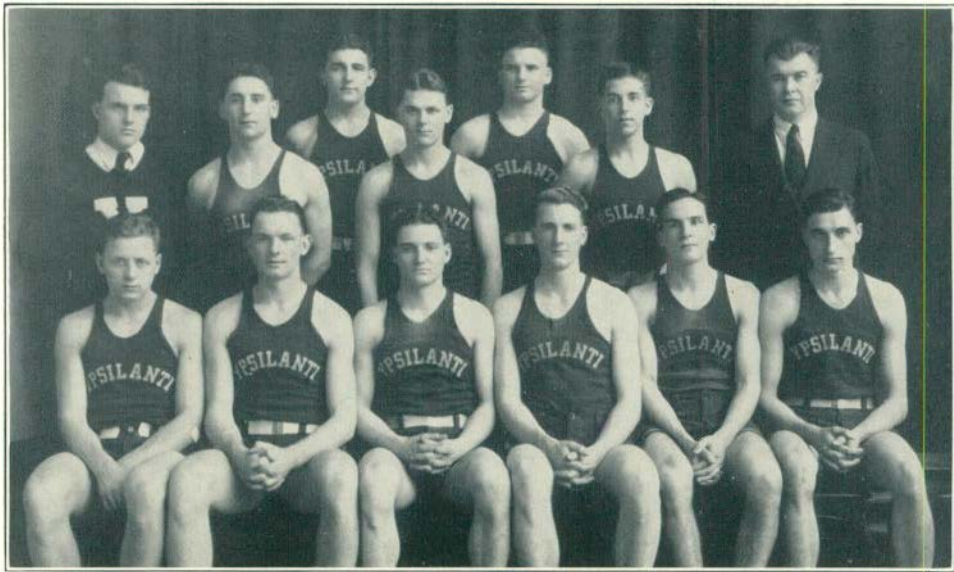

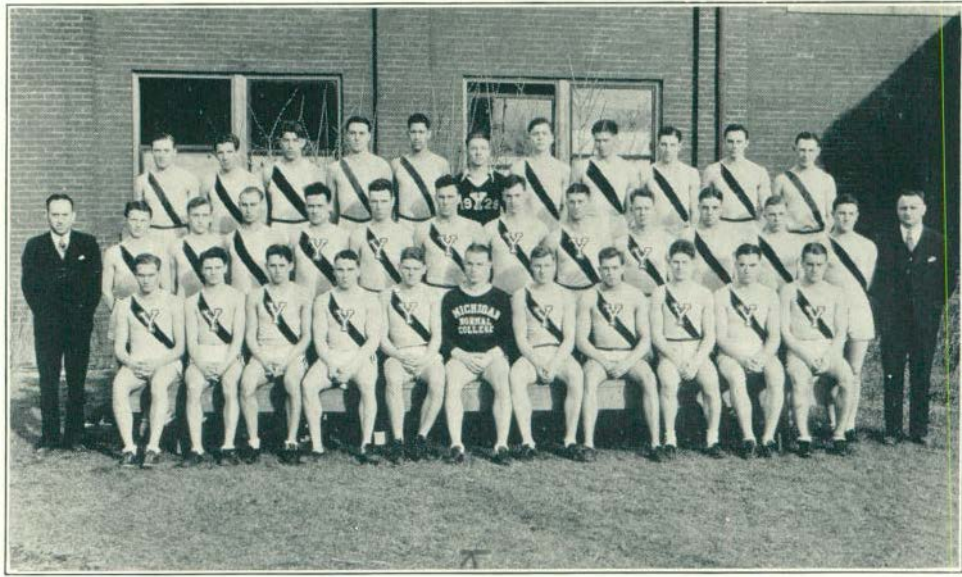


BASEBALL

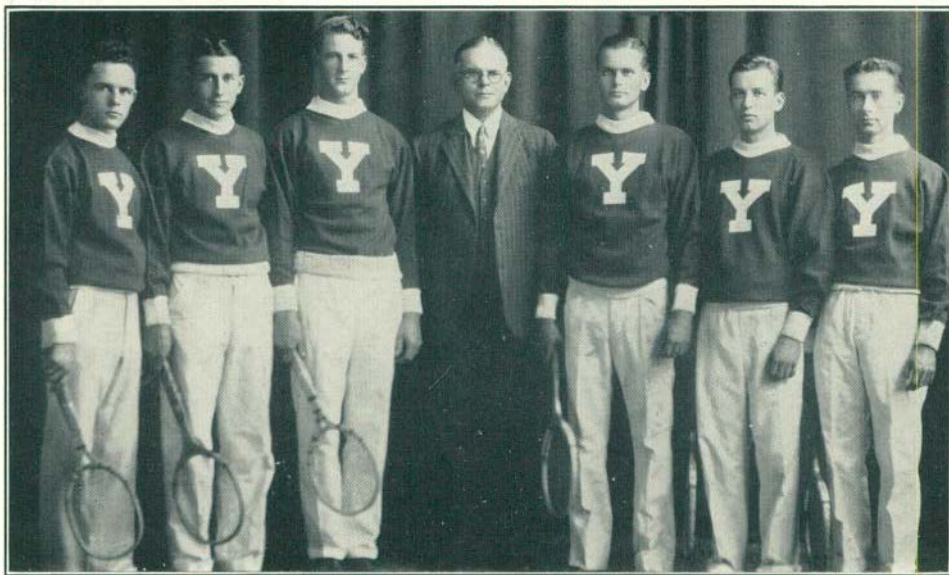
CROSS COUNTRY
