Here are echoes from Sleepy Hollow, Cries from old Detroit and years gone by, Yells from the stadium and court follow, These are the sounds of the old Huron try.




For more than a half century Dr. Munson has rendered conscientious and constructive educational service to the State of Michigan. His record of consistent progress is an inspiration to us all. Beginning as a teacher in a one-room school in Northern Michigan, he became, in succession, superintendent of schools in several localities, deputy superintendent of public instruction and director of Michigan's fifty county normals, acting superintendent of public instruction, director of teacher training and placement at Central Michigan Normal School, president of Northern Michigan Normal for ten years, and during the past fifteen years he has been president of his and our alma mater. He was a member of the State Board of Education Advisory Commission for eleven years from its incipiency. He served several years as editor of Michigan Moderator Topics, the immediate predecessor of the Michigan Education Journal. He was one of the first members of the Michigan Teachers' Retirement Fund Board, and a member of many other important Michigan and national educational committees and commissions.

Throughout his distinguished career, his record has been one of educational statesmanship of a high order and withal a strong stabilizing influence in the educational affairs of Michigan.


















Freshman Class History

Varsity Football

The Hurons opened the season against the Scots of Alma College on September 26. Playing under the lights before a capacity crowd that had come to witness the twenty-fifth meeting of the two teams, the Huron eleven got off to what looked like goal-bound drive. This initial offense was stopped by the Scots five yards short of pay dirt. The rest of the first half was marked by fumbles and intercepted passes. The Scots, however, crashed through the scoring column on a ten-yard cff tackle run by the Scot left halfback, Rex Roseman. The kick was wide for the conversion and the score at the end of the third quarter stood at 6-0. The Scots put over another tally as Roseman again bucked his way into pay dirt. The final score Alma 12 MSNC 0.

The Huron eleven opened their home stand at Briggs Field against Illinois Normal before well over two thousand fans. The first 57 minutes of play were hard fought by both teams with

Normal journeyed to DeKalb, Illinois for the third game with hopes of upsetting the Huskies in their homecoming game. The Huron hopes were not realized as Northern Illinois ace quarter back, Don Fortunato passed his team to a decisive 21-6 victory. This game produced the first Huron score of the season as Corky Foster, right half, went over for the touchdown. Clare Ebersole's attempted conversion was blocked. The final score Northern Illinois 21 MSNC 6.

With the slogan "Ninety-Eight Years And Still Normal" the Huron Homecoming festivities got under way as three thousand


loyal fans braved inclement weather to witness the game. The Dutchmen of Hope College furnished the Huron opposition on a rain soaked field. Normal drew first blood as half-back Jim Martin intercepted a pass in the second quarter and scampered forty-five yards to score.

The Huron line stood off the determined Dutchmen in the first half to keep on the long end of a 7-0 score at half time. It wasn't till the last quarter that signs of victory began to fade as the passing of quarter back Nick Yonkers sparked the Dutchmen to two touchdowns. Both of the touchdowns were scored by Bob Emery, Hope full back. Bright spots of the game were Dale Alderson's quick kicking, and an improved Huron eleven. The final score Hope College 12 MSNC 7.

The fifth game was played at Briggs Field against Hillsdale. Although the Huron eleven showed signs of improvement it was not enough to overcome the strong Dale squad. It was during the second half of this game that captain, Charles Lane suffered a dislocated shoulder. The scoring consisted of two safeties and two touchdowns by the Dale half back, Tom Ward. Final score Hillsdale 15 MSNC 2.

The Normal eleven met their sixth straight defeat at the hands of Central Michigan. The Huron's furnished the competition for the Chips homecoming. The Green and White showed some sparks of life in the contest as Van Riper broke through the Chip line for a 40 yard run but was stopped short of the goal line and Syl Wojcecki returned a Central Michigan kickoff 91 yards to the Chips nine yard line but half time ran out after one uncompleted pass attempt. The final score Central Michigan 33 MSNC 0.

The only victory of the season came in the last game against a highly favored Ball State eleven at Briggs Field. This not only broke the Huron six game losing streak but handed the




Varsity Basketball








Completing a program of extensive participation and comprehensive planning on the part of the student directors, managers and Dr. Olds, everyone looks forward to an even better program next year.






W.R.A. Swimming
