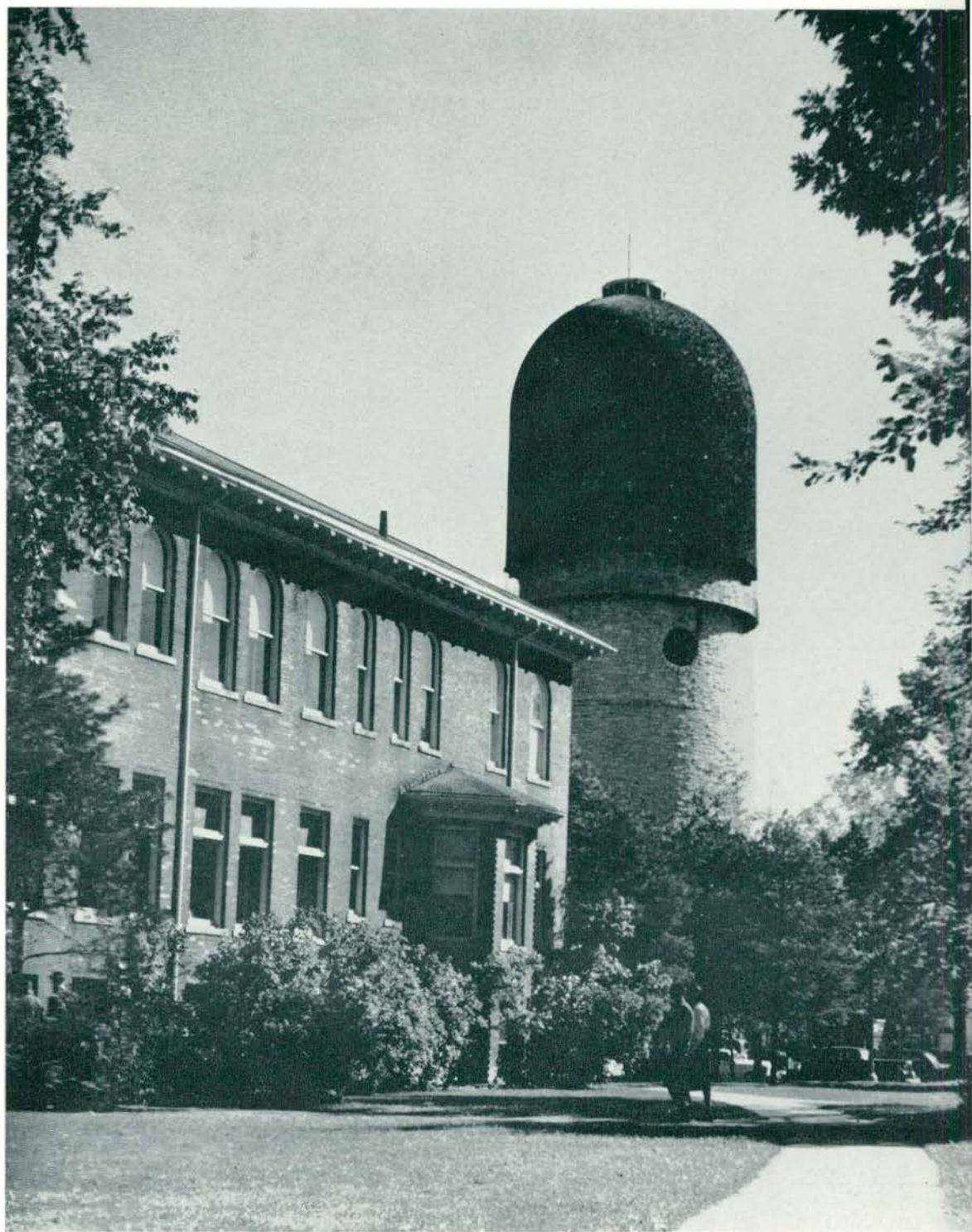

THE UNION



As a part of the education program, Michigan State Normal College has attempted to make her students good citizens by teaching them to live with one another and to respect the ideals of their fellow students.

The assistant to this program has been Charles McKenny Hall, one of the best equipped unions any small college can possess. It has been the go-between of study and relaxation.

McKenny Hall, as the center of campus activities, facilitates our students with its informal lounges, the cafeteria, and the new modern basement grill opened in the fall of 1950. Moments of relaxation are provided for many of the students in the Billiard Room or the Bowling Alley. When the college fraternities, sororities, and other college organizations sponsor dances, the large ballroom gives all those attending plenty of space to twirl while they dance.

This year, under the new management of Mr. Eldon E. Lawson, Charles McKenny Hall will prove to be a better Union for the students of Michigan State Normal College.





THE COLLEGE LIBRARY



The Library is one of the older buildings on campus. There are approximately 130,000 volumes in the library, and most of these are education books. The three large reading rooms which were redecorated last spring offer study facilities for many students.

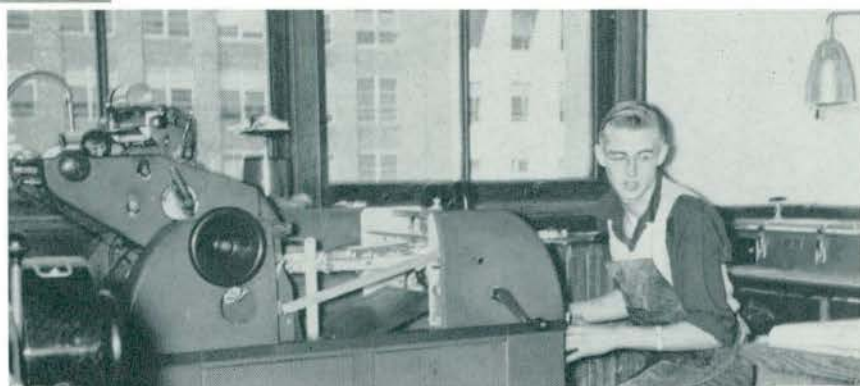


THE ARTS BUILDING

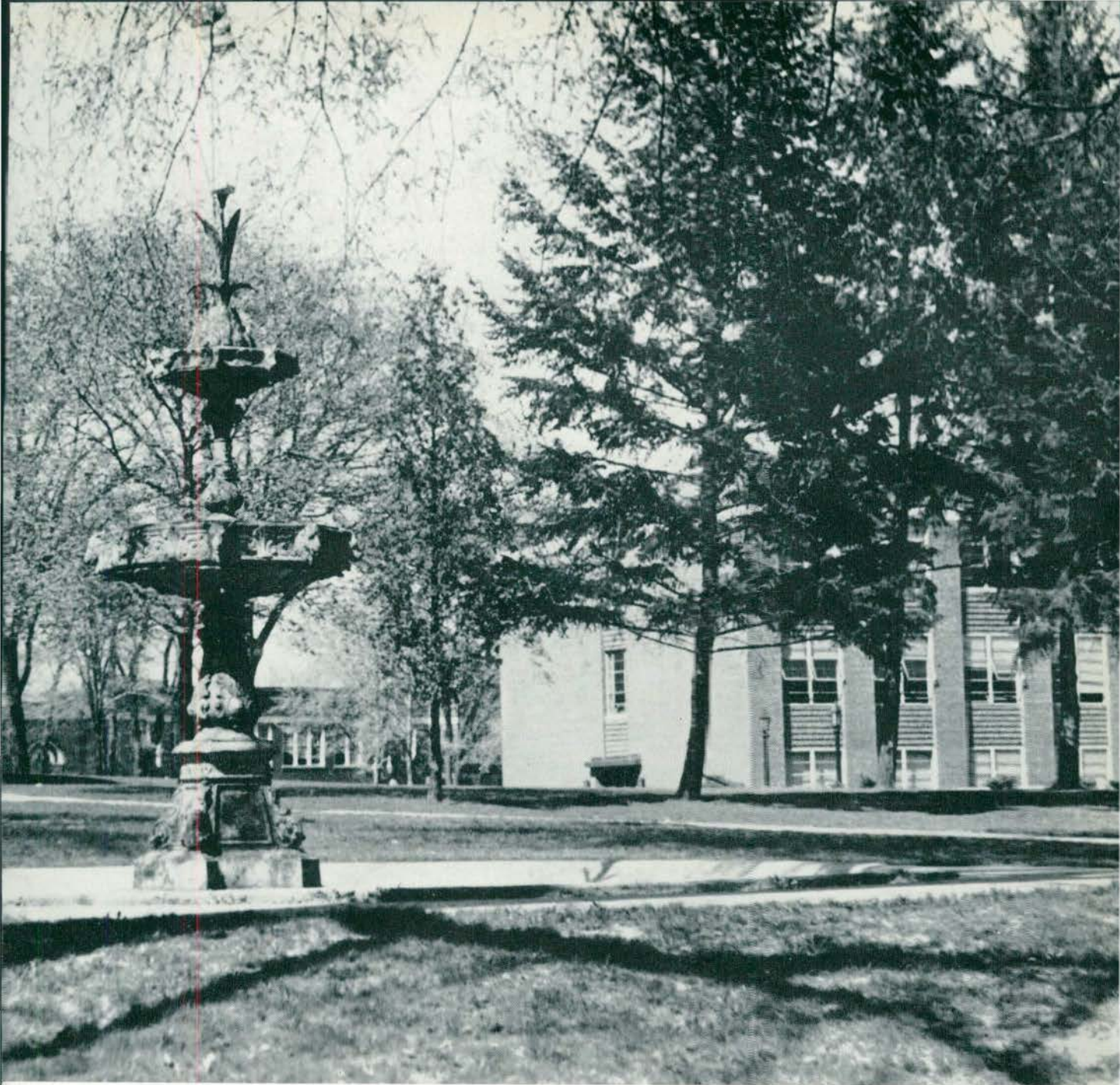

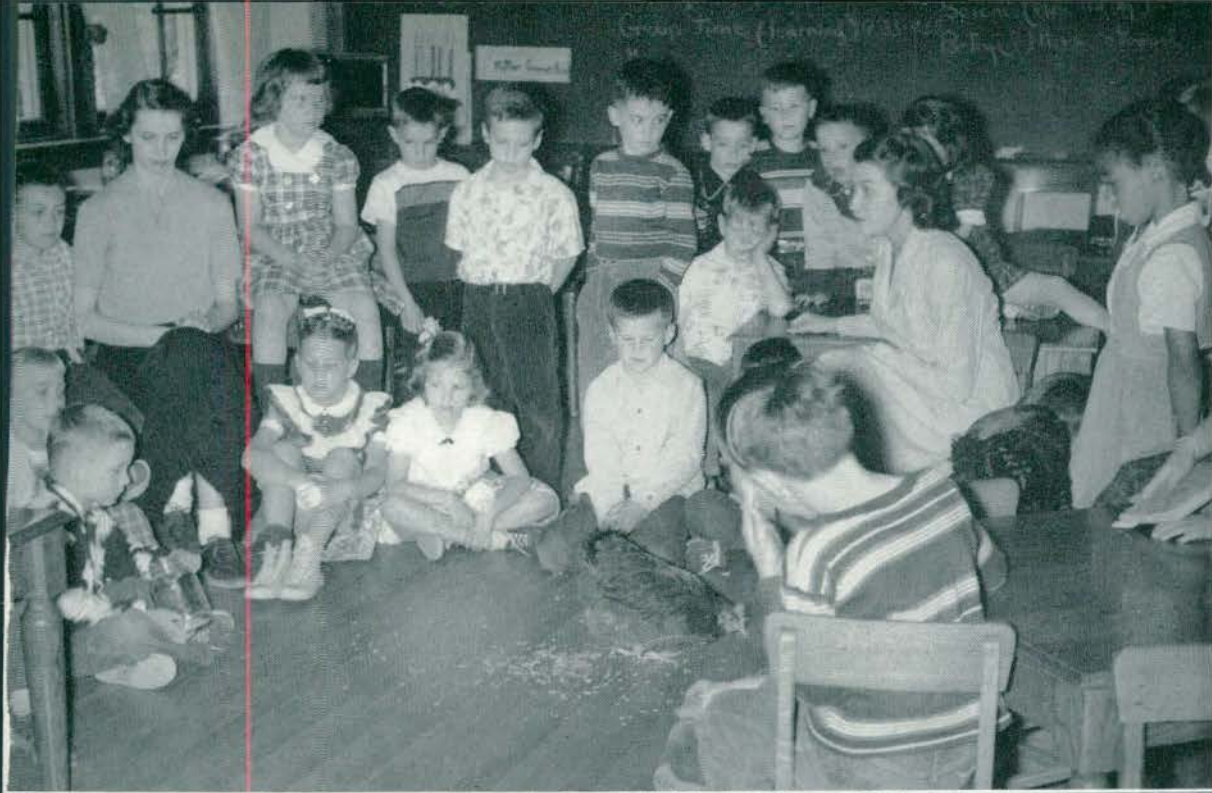
Practice teaching offers practical experience as shown by this student teacher and her Kindergarten class.

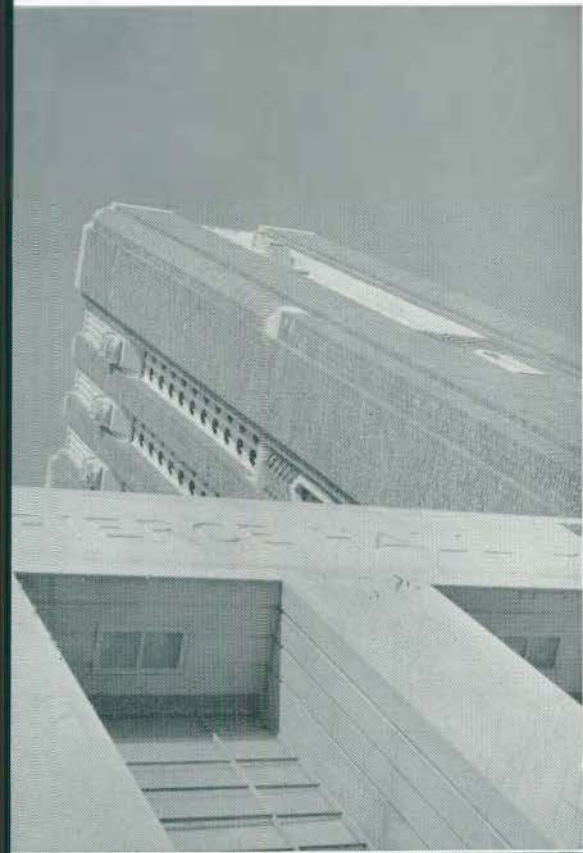

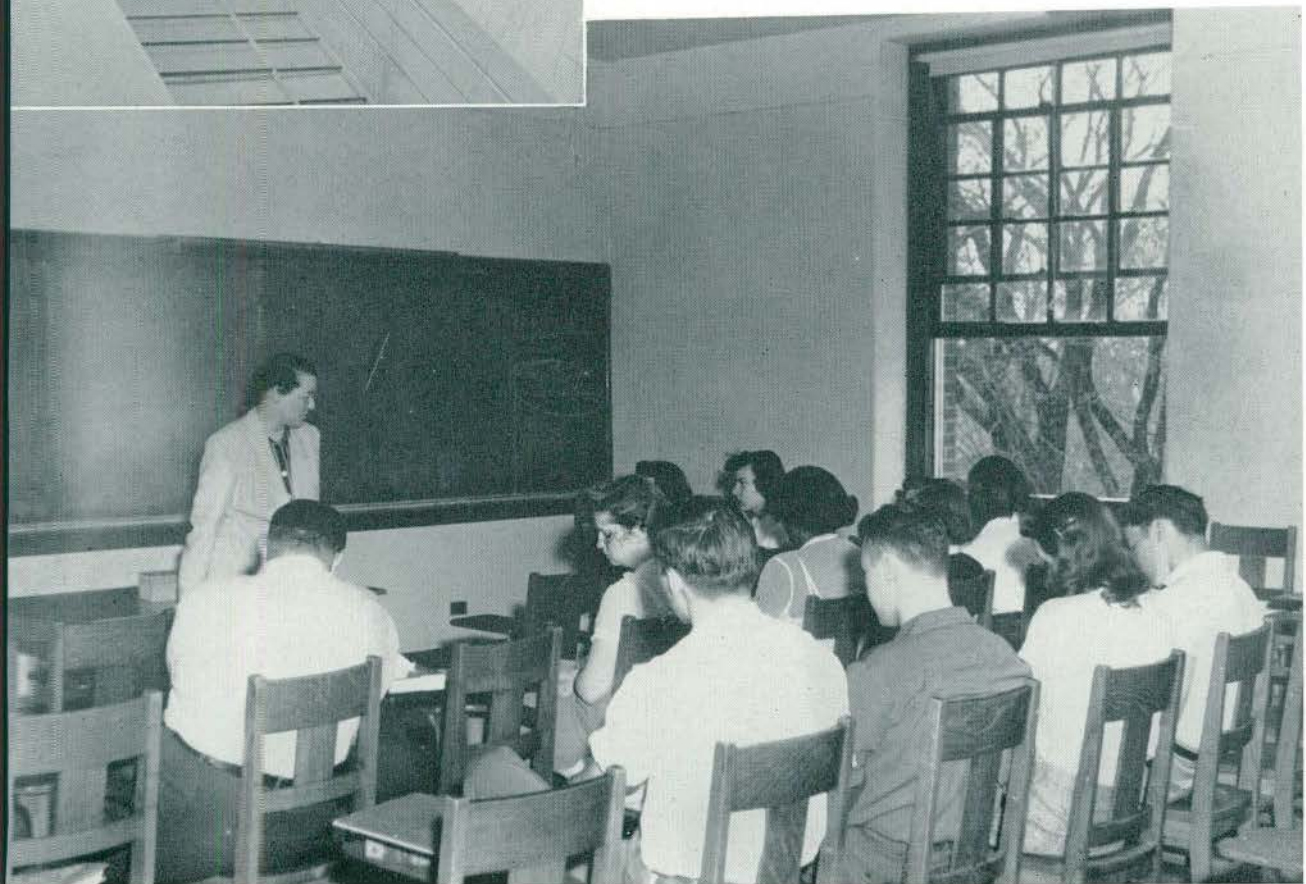
Students at an entrance to Pierce Hall between English classes.

The Music Department sponsors musical activities that are a source of enjoyment to the campus open to non-specializing students as well as those majoring in music. Among these activities are the Choral Union, The College Choir, The Marching and Concert Bands, and The Orchestra.



Special Education

The purpose of special education is to help the exceptional child enjoy as full a life as his capabilities will permit. With this in mind it is the aim of the Special Education curriculum to train people to become the type of teachers who can fulfill this purpose as effectively as possible.



Occupational Therapy

By adapting occupations to the handicapped person's limitations, Occupational Therapy helps him to regain his place in life with new confidence. The Occupational Therapy curriculum at Michigan State Normal College trains therapists to guide these persons.





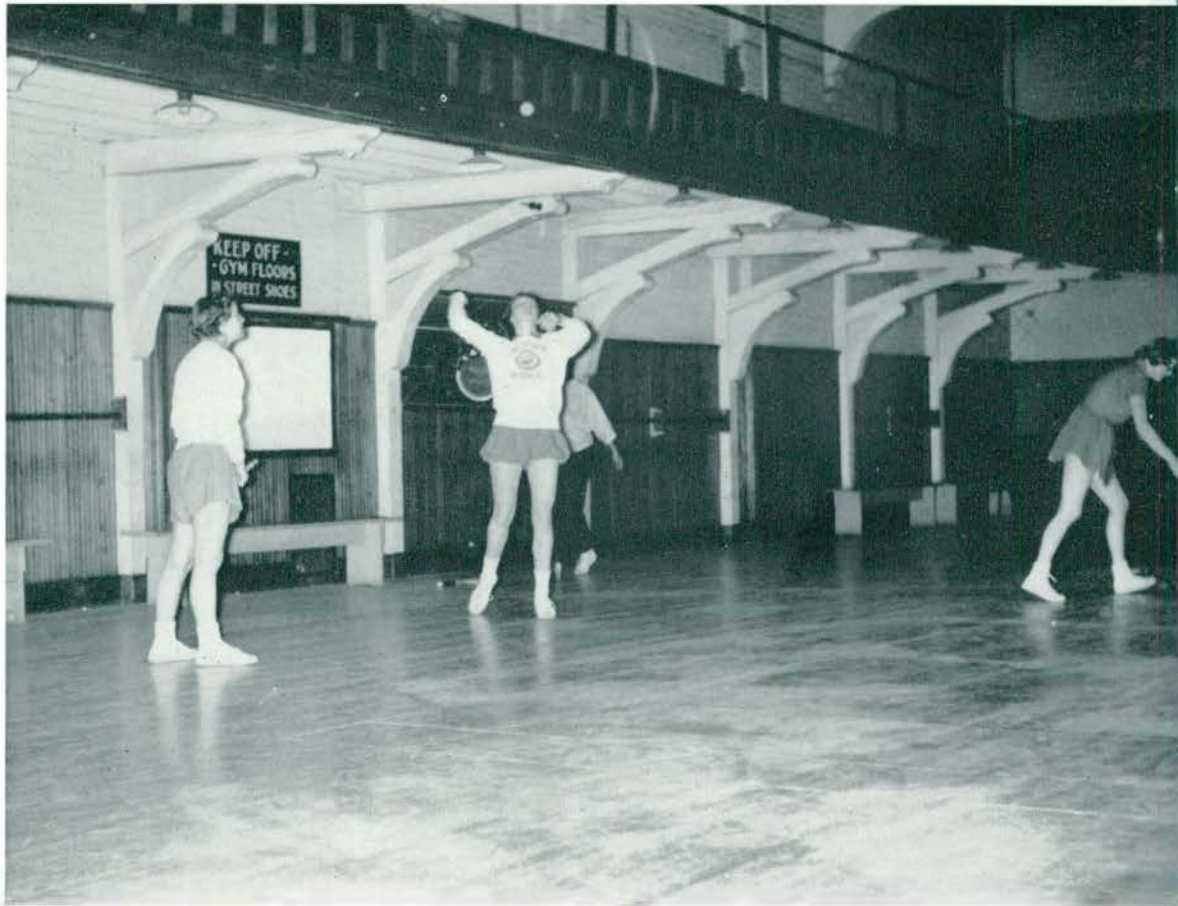
Industrial Arts

Home Economics



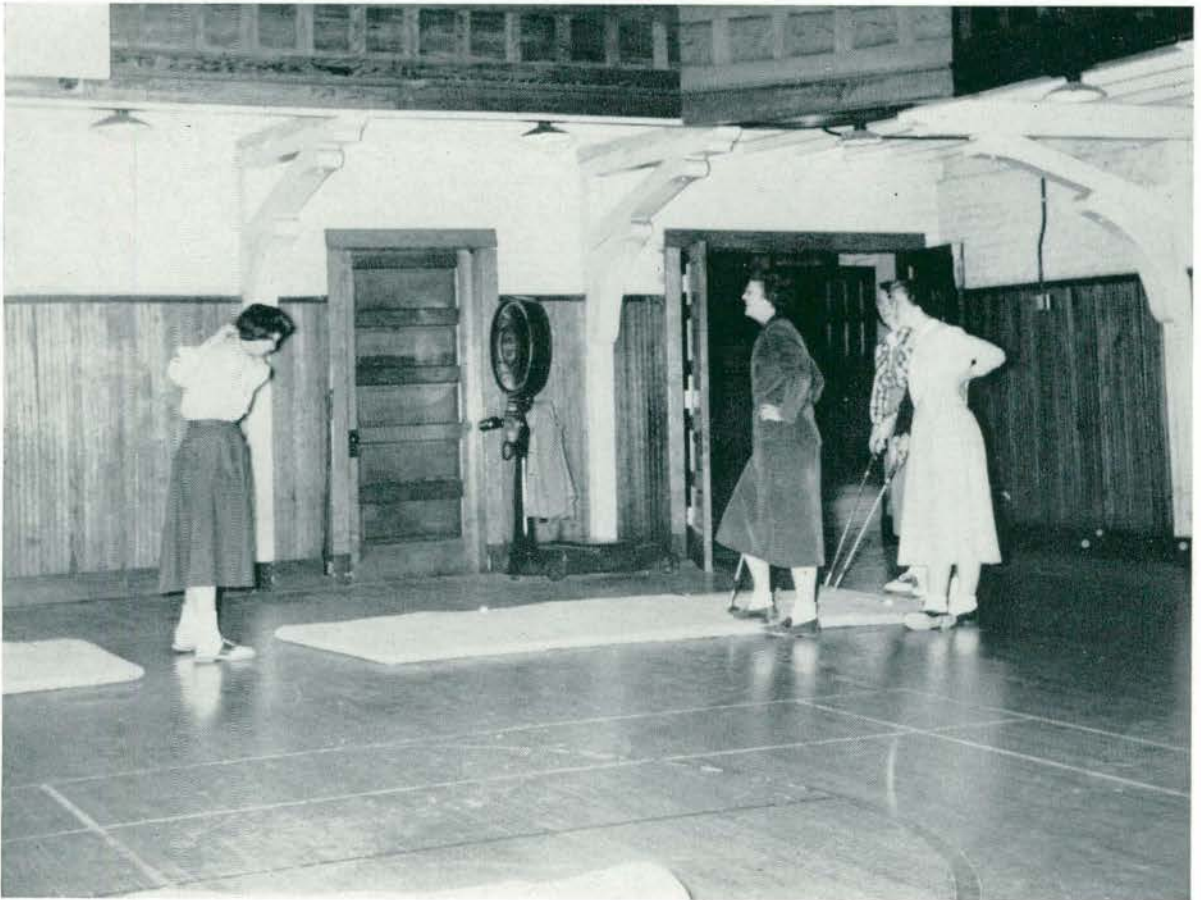
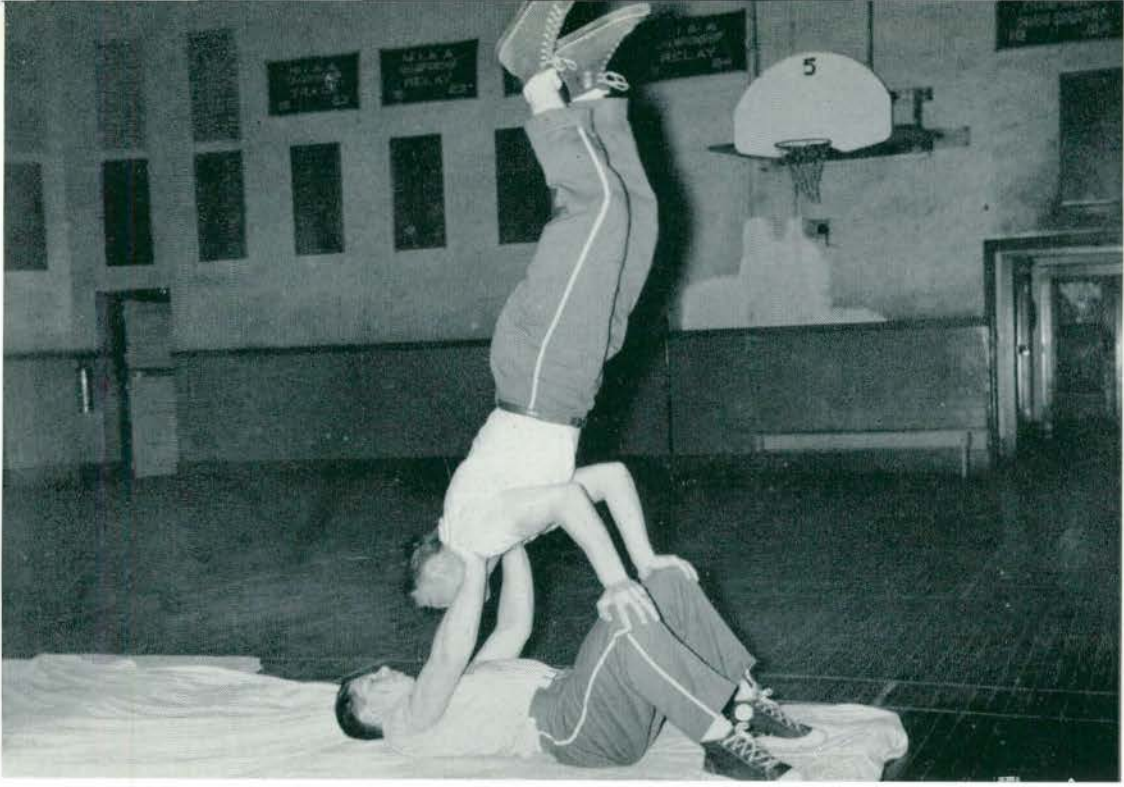

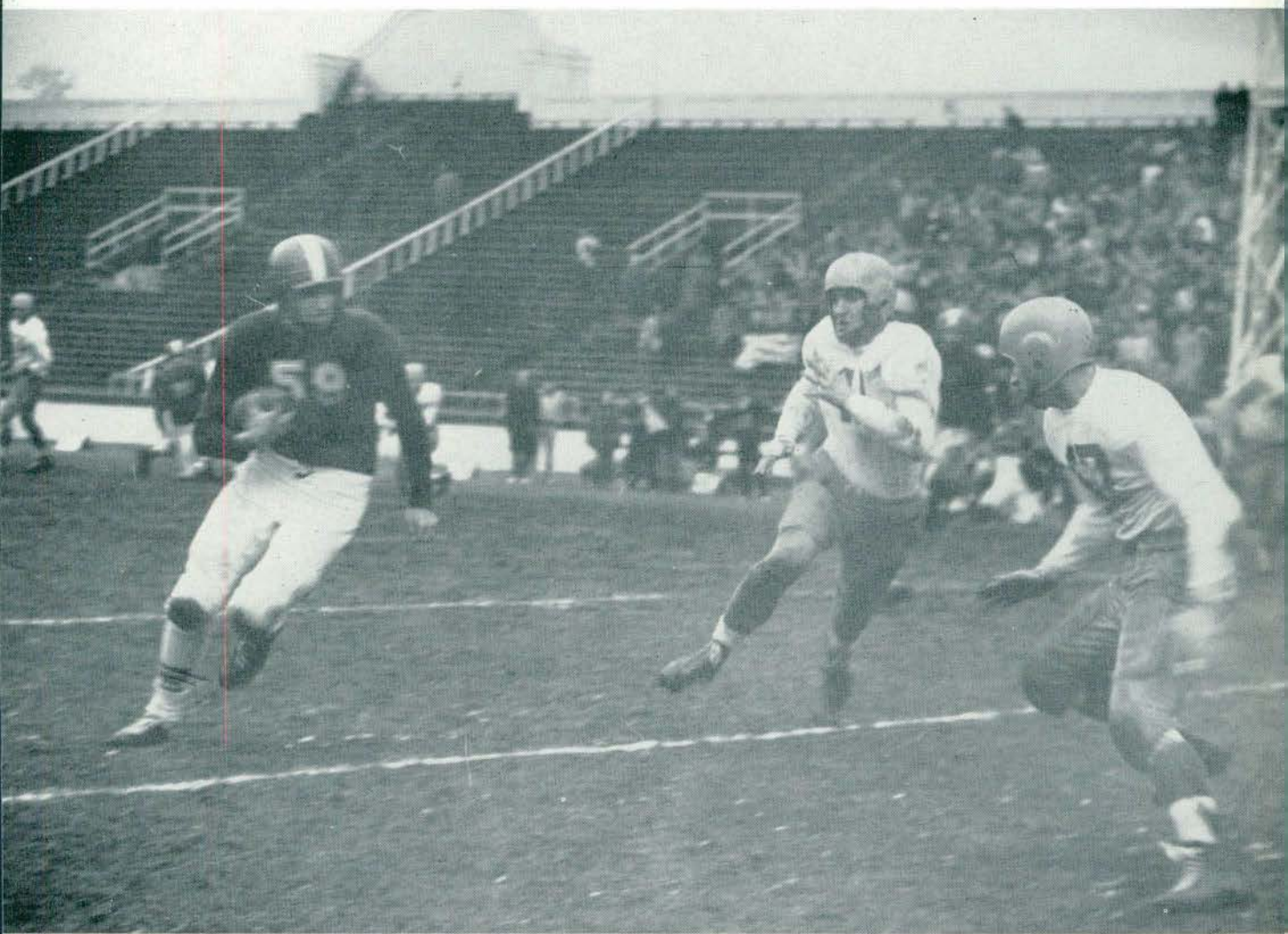


Michigan Normal vs Illinois Normal

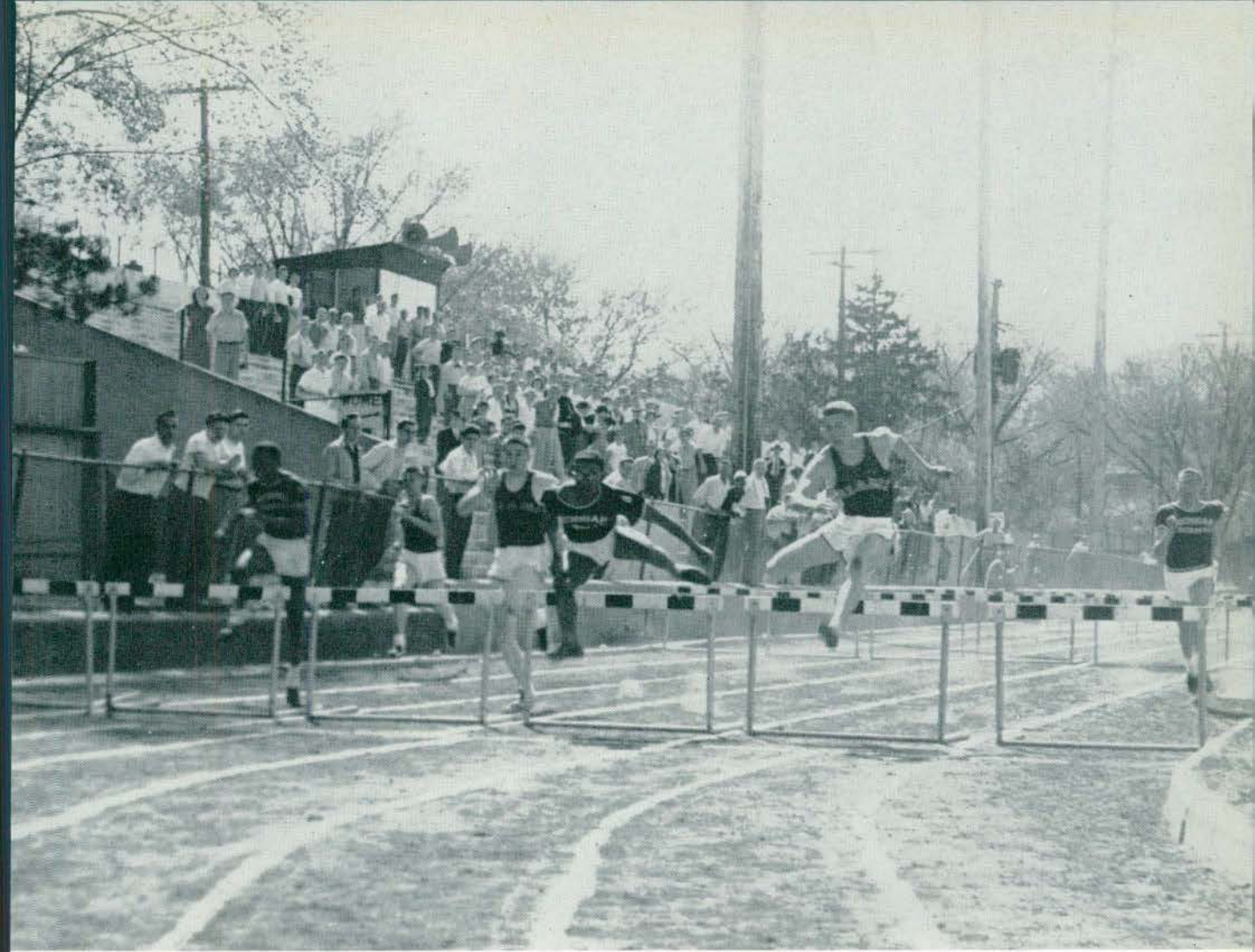

Track — 1952

Michigan Normal had its usual successful track season in 1952 with numerous records falling during the course of the year for Coach George Marshall's team. The Hurons repeated as IIAC champs among other things while showing their heels to most of their opponents during both the indoor and outdoor seasons. Bob Parks, running the halfmile and quartermile, was team captain for the year.

The Hurons showed great potentialities for the future with a great many freshmen and sophomores on the squad. Perhaps the brightest among the first year men were sprinter Jim Reindel, hurdler Joe Howard, vaulter Marland Bluhm, and 440 man Glenn Davis. The second year stars were led by Sy Collins in the dashes and low hurdles. The only senior letter-winners lost to the team by graduation will be shot-putter John Koczman and Parks.

Among the accomplishments of the team were triumphs over Bradley University, Western Michigan, and Central Michigan while the large relay meets provided plenty of medals and trophies for MSNC. The mile relay team of Bruce Jacobs, Glenn Davis, Bob Parks, and Stan McConner broke the school record with a 3:18.4 clocking. The Hurons were hosts to the IIAC meet, the Central Collegiates, and the Central States AAU outdoors.

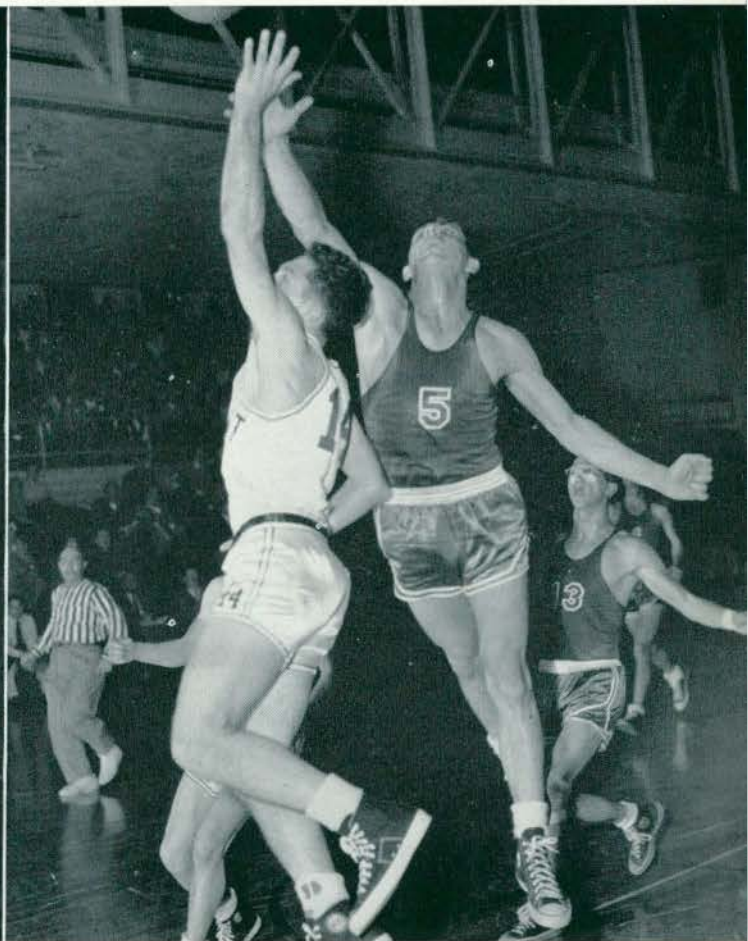
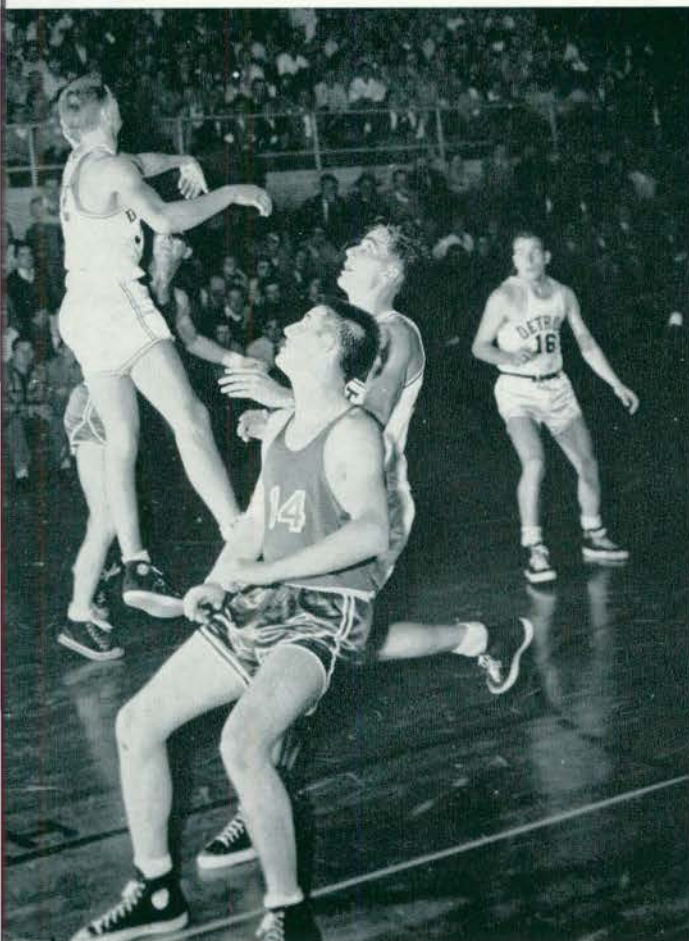


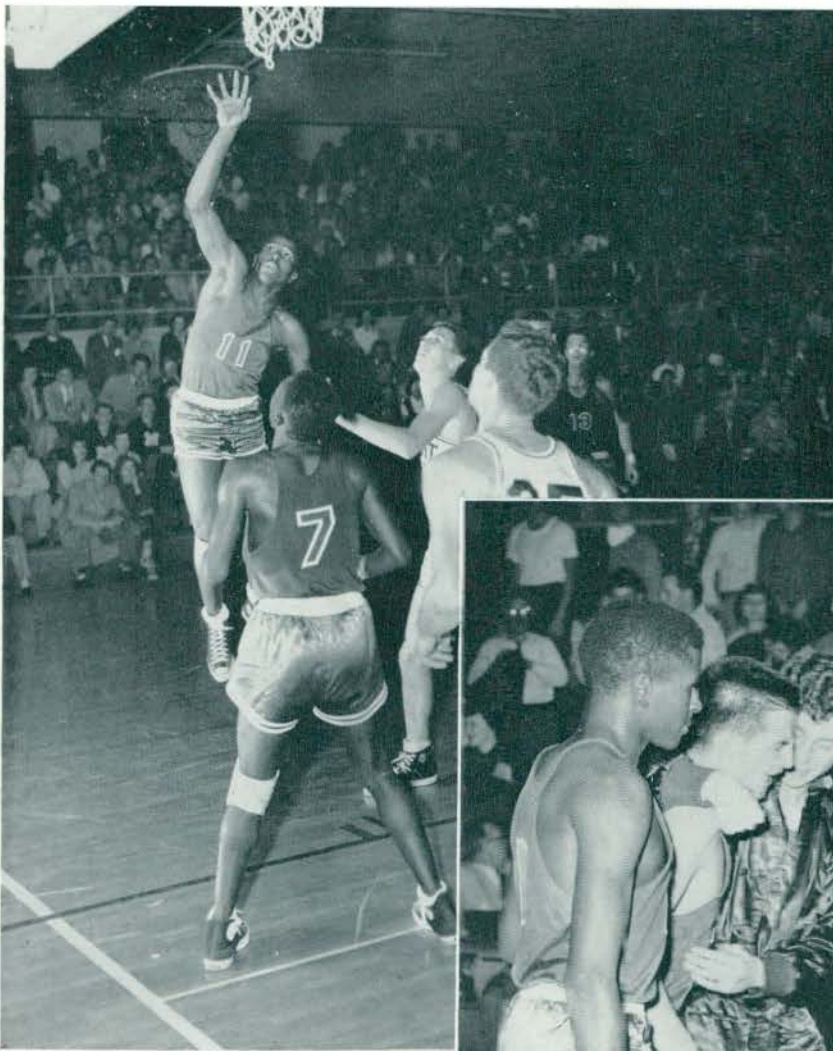
Basketball — 1951-52

With a final, won nine, lost eleven basketball record for the 1951-1952 season Coach Bill Crouch, although failing to break even for the year, found comfort in seeing his team take a fourth place in the Interstate Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. The League record was an even 5-5 mark.

Freshman Webster Kirksey of Saginaw was the key man in the offense scoring 325 points during the 20 game season—a 16.3 average. This broke the old school scoring mark of 318 points set by Fred Jackson in 1948-1949. Webbie was picked for several all-opponent teams and was a second-team choice on the All-IIAC five.

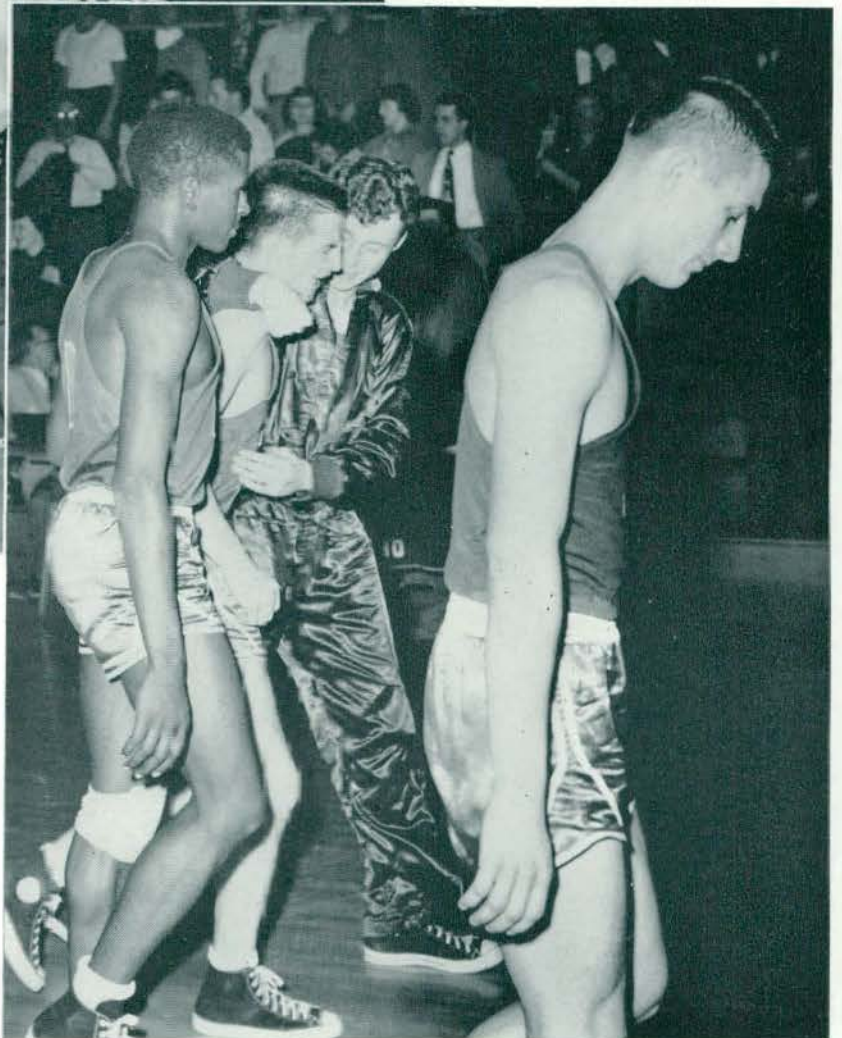

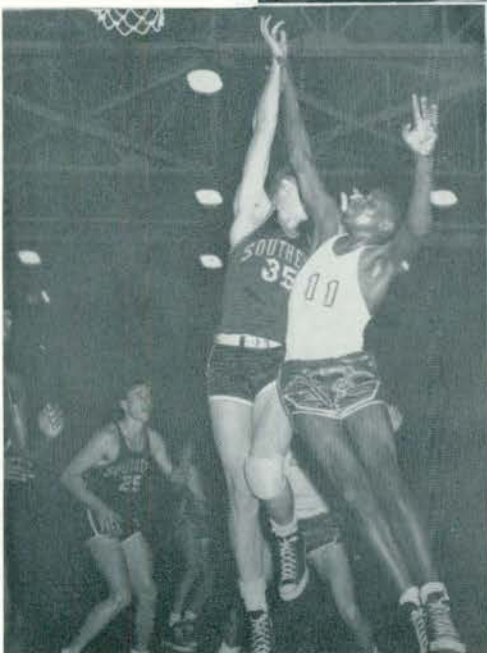
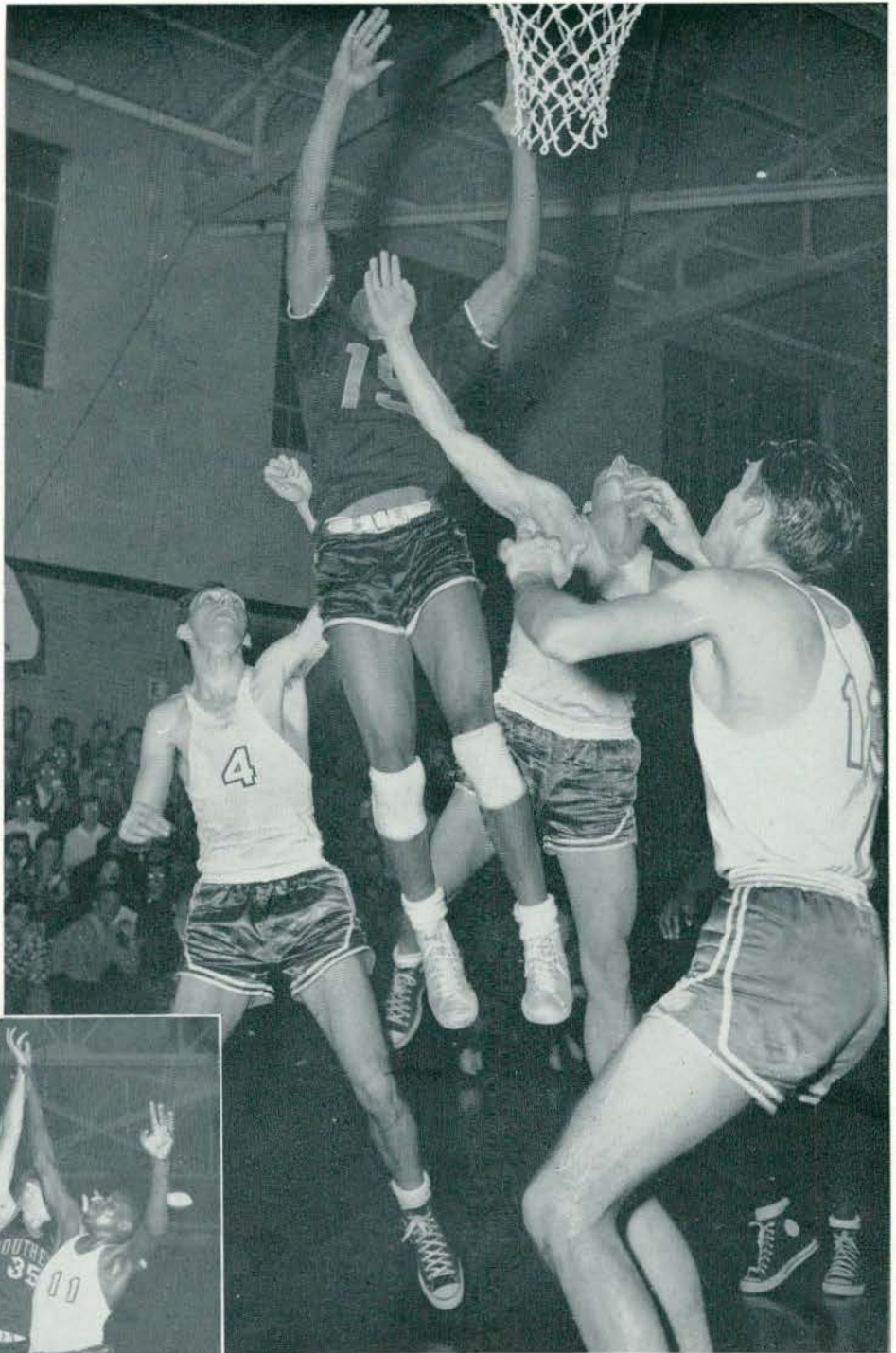

Baseball – 1952

Coach Bill Crouch's Hurons enjoyed a very successful baseball season this year as they compiled an enviable winning record. A young team, loaded with freshmen and sophomores, they swept double-headers from Eastern Illinois, Northern Illinois, and University of Detroit among other accomplishments. Captain Bob Shankie, in his second year at the helm, led the Normalites from his second base position.

The two strong right arms of Art Sheridan and Paul Temple were instrumental in the victorious campaign as was the timely long ball hitting of right fielder Stan Tomczyk. All of these men were under serious consideration for all-league honors in the IIAC. The remainder of the pitching staff was composed of lefthanders Bill Mills and Dean Pope and right hander Milo Danziesen. Chuck Hatch and Ron Oestrike did the honors behind the plate for Normal.

Three freshmen composed the left side of the infield with LeRoy Mawby and Jerry David alternating at third, and Dick Moseley at shortstop. Ralph Grubb, a junior, was at first base. Switch-hitting Rudy Hill in centerfield, and Jim Sciarini in left comprised the rest of the outer gardens although Temple and Sheridan occasionally appeared in roles other than hurling. The former won his own game against U. of D. with a homer, triple, and two singles.





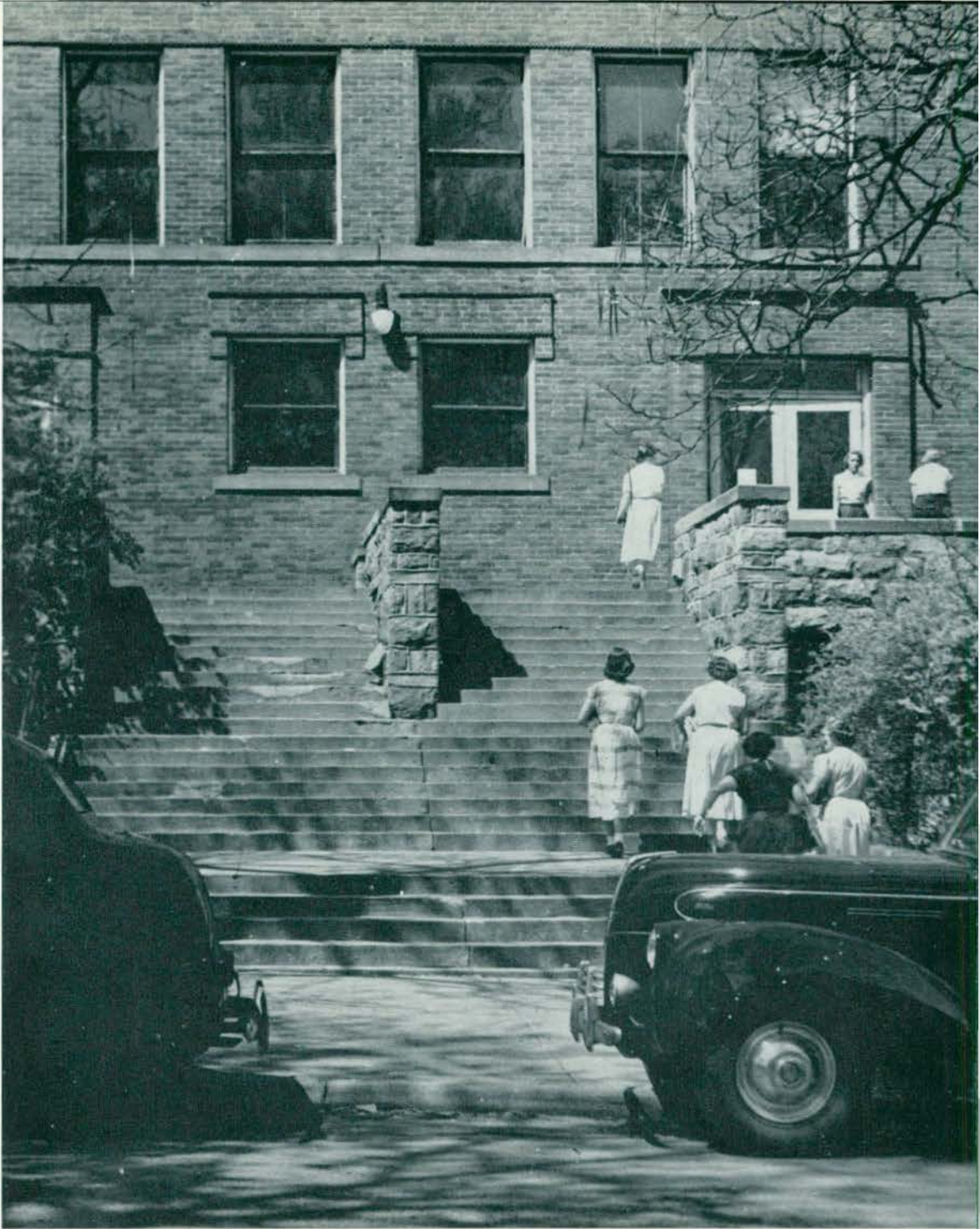

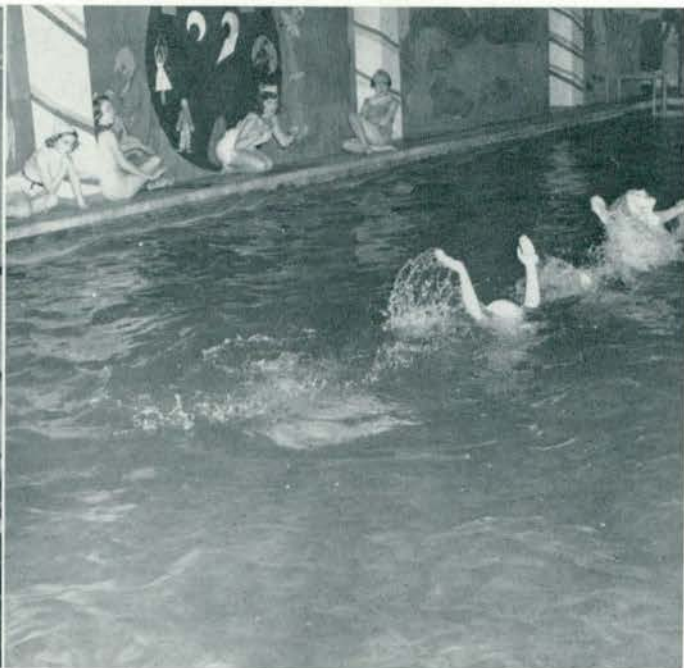




Girls' Sports

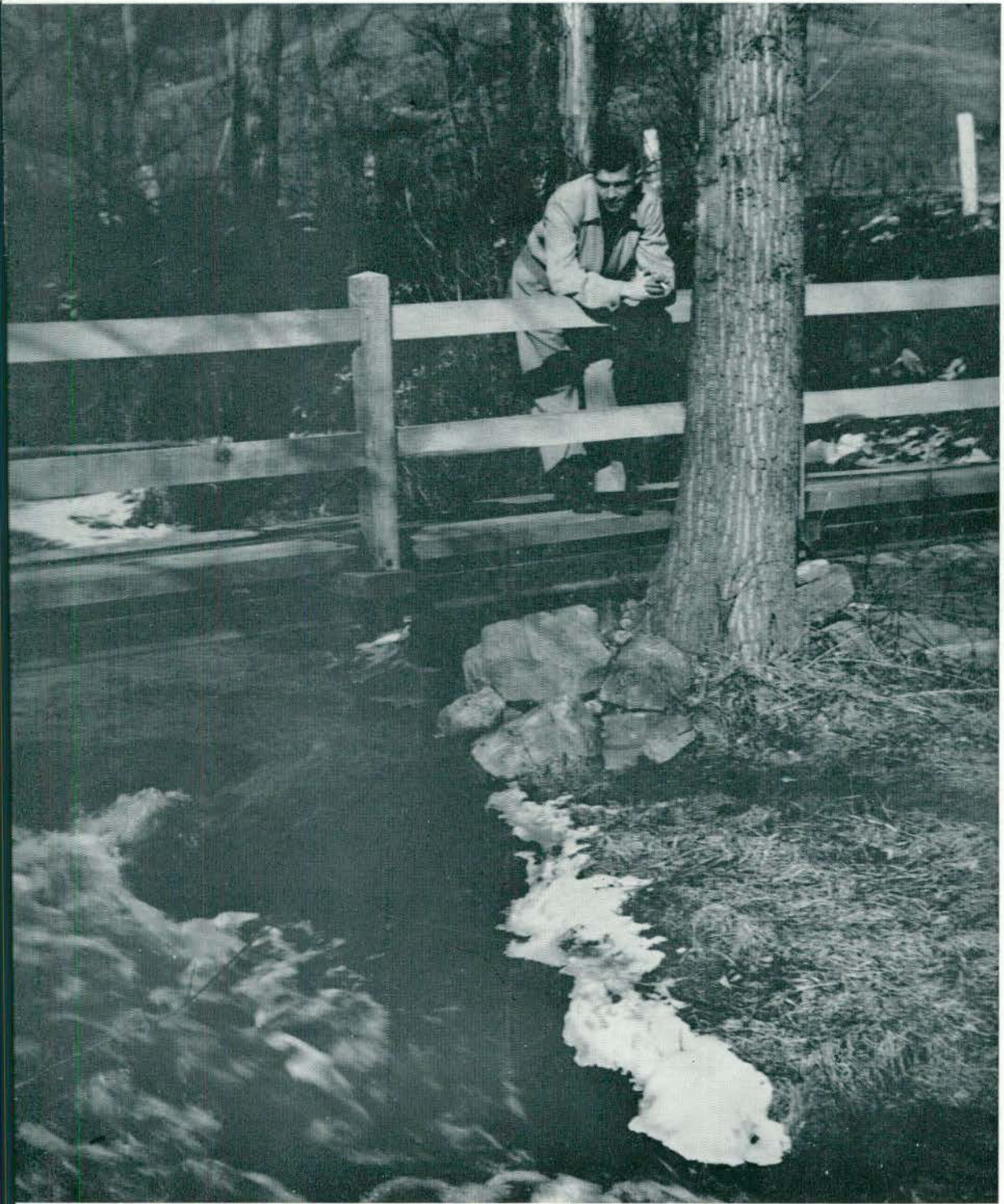

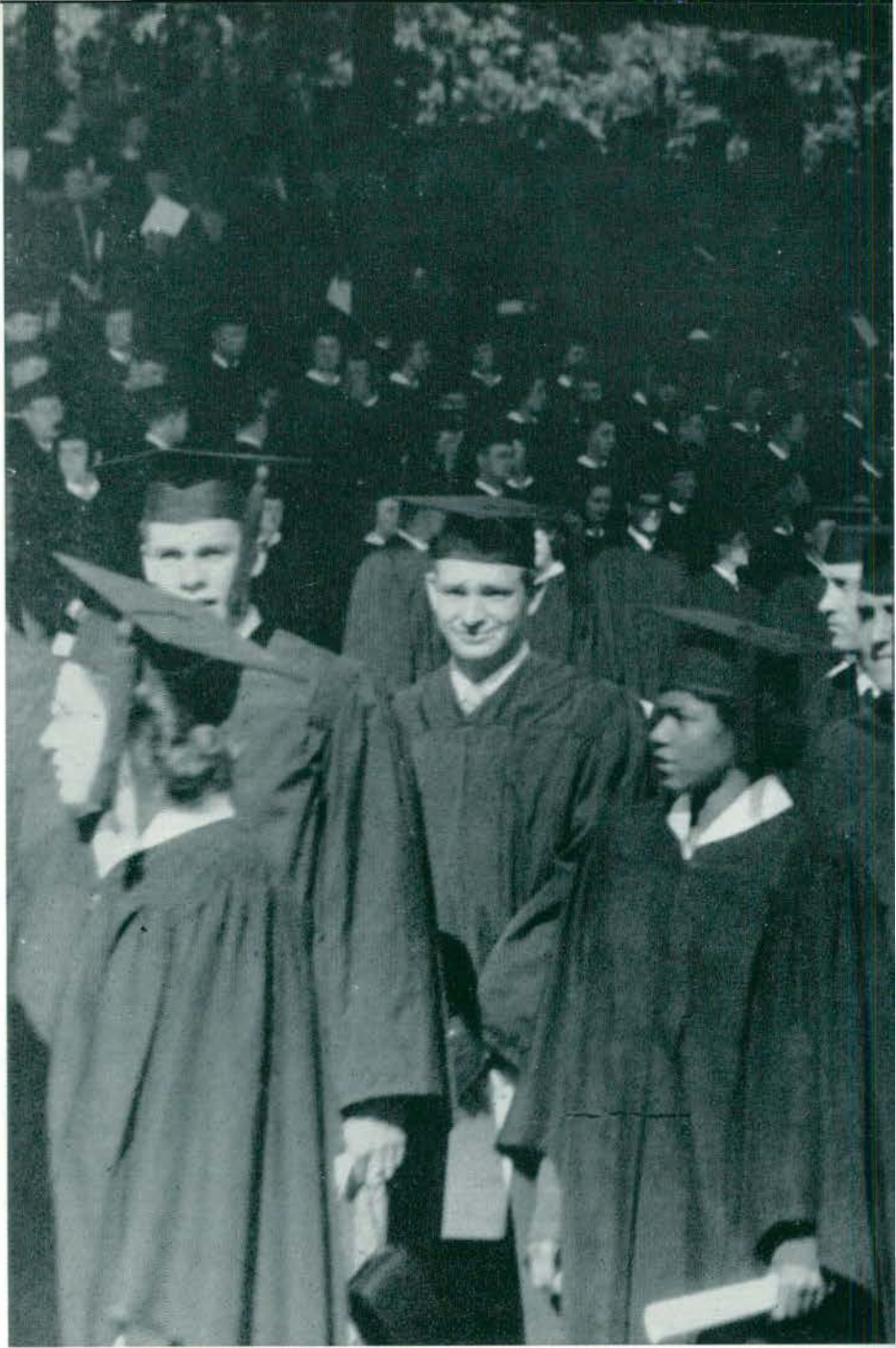
