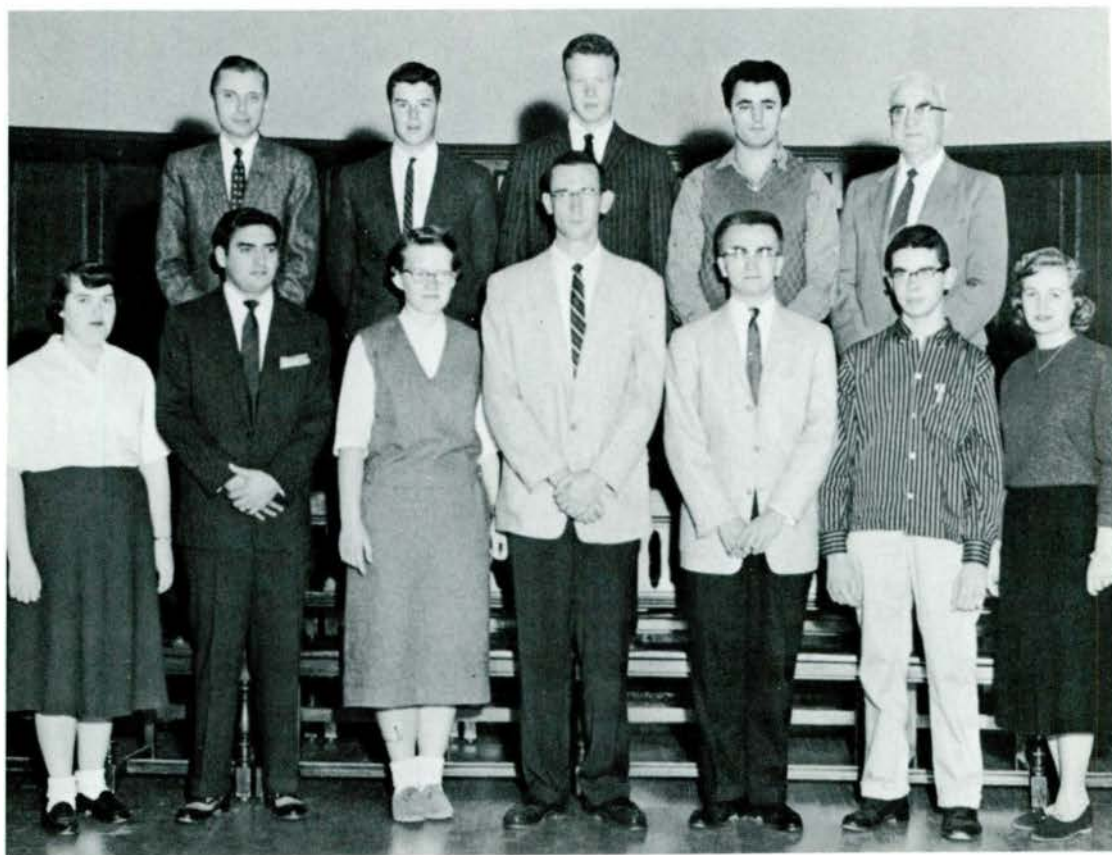

# ENGLISH & SPEECH

The Department of English and Speech is of primary importance. Here, the freshmen brush up on composition, literature and speech, so necessary for communication. Here, also, are the advanced classes in writing, literature, speech, interpretation and dramatic arts.

One of the main interests of the department is the forensics program. The department directs this extra-curricular activity, which is open to everyone, in the areas of oratory, extemporaneous speaking, discussion, public speaking, debate, and interpretive reading. EMC, with twelve other Michigan colleges, forms the Michigan InterCollegiate Speech League. This league sponsors various tournaments for oratory, discussion, and debate. Eastern has won three of these tournaments in the past year and placed first in many individual contests. Active on campus is Pi Kappa Delta, the largest honorary speech society in the United States.



The answer to an educator's dream, Interpretive Reading class is full of opportunities for active participation. The students deal with the fundamental problems of oral interpretation, developing poise and ease before an audience, a clear and forceful voice, and flexibility and discrimination in interpreting the thought to others.



Active participation in committees, panels, and forums develops comprehension of the principles and practice of discussion and conference.

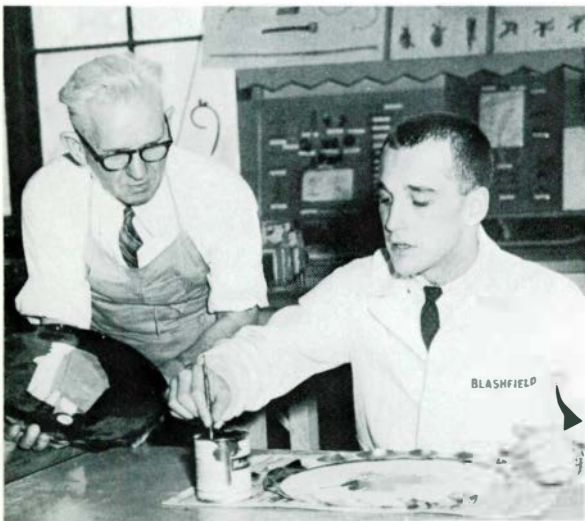

Briggs Building, which houses the department.

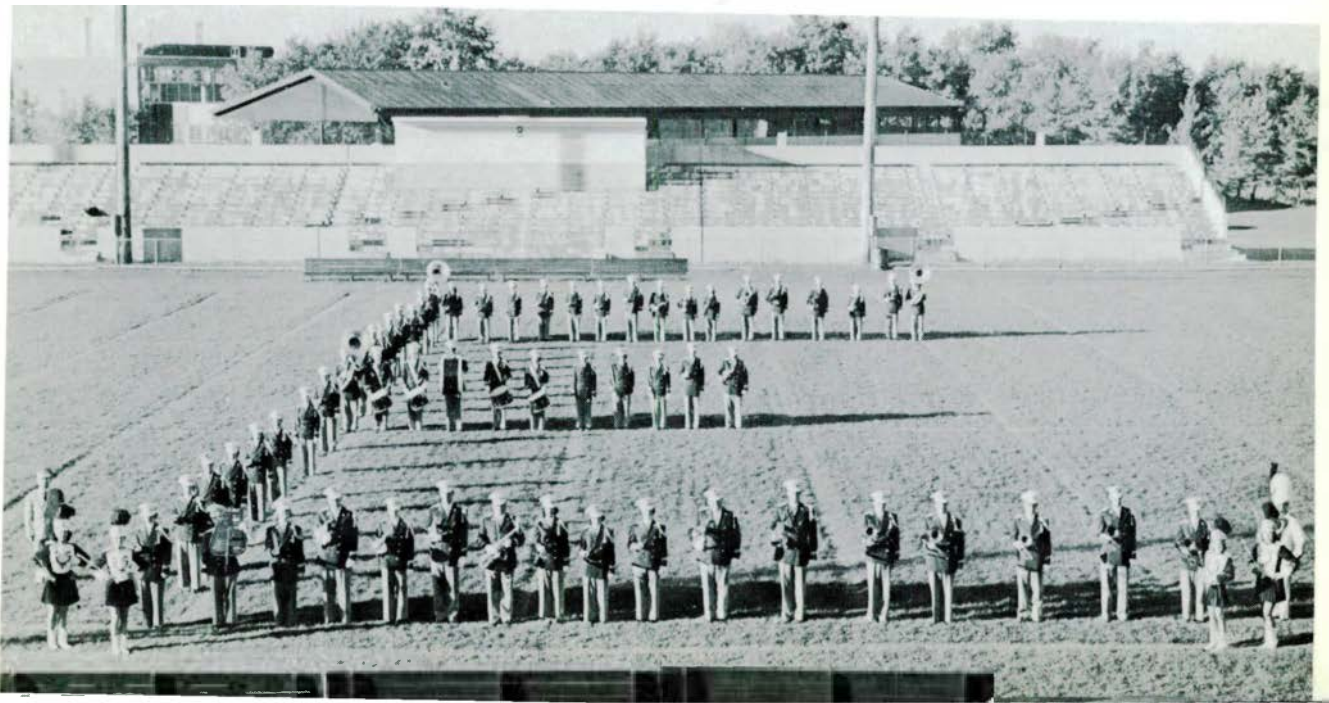

### 1909-1959



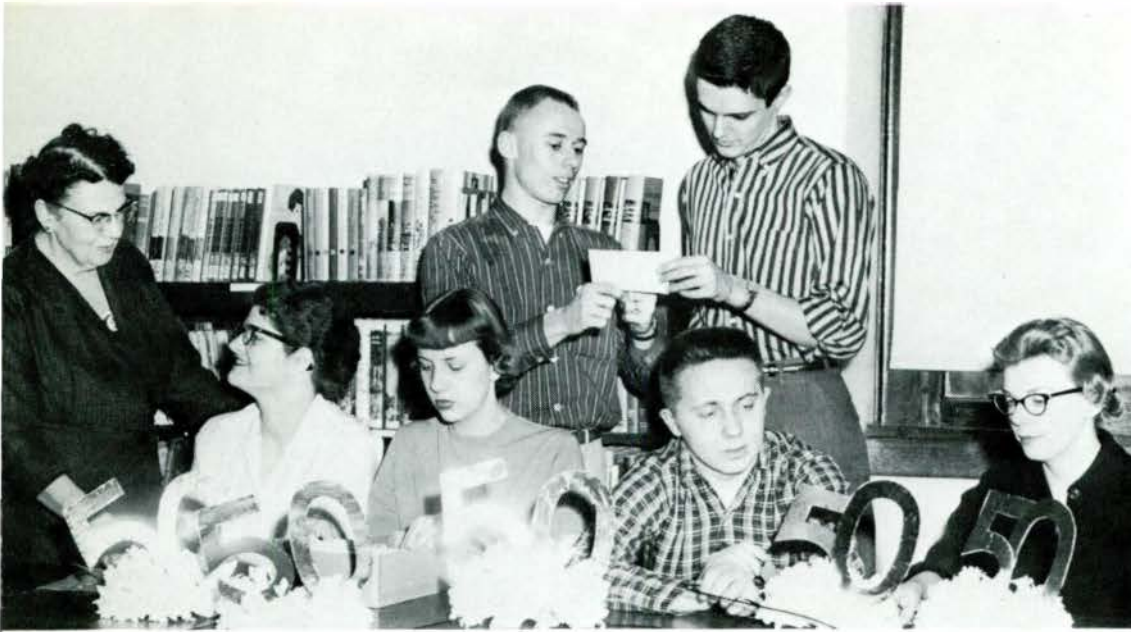
Stoic Society enjoys the distinction of being the oldest honorary society on campus. The group had its beginnings in January 1909 at an informal gathering in the home of Professor J. Stuart Lathers, head of the Department of Oratory of Michigan State Normal College.

A scholarship fund was begun in 1909 to encourage promising sophomore students to return for their third year of study, for at that time, it was customary for those preparing to teach to remain in college only two years. The organization now awards a scholarship to each officer, and administers twelve scholarship funds with a principal totaling over \$15,000. Nominees for membership are still selected from the sophomore class and members are chosen by vote of the membership and the faculty on the basis of scholarship, moral responsibility, helpfulness in school affairs, and initiative.

Stoic traditions which have continued over the years are the White Elephant Sale, the Reception for New Members, the Stoic Banquet, and the May Breakfast.

Beginning with only eleven members, Stoic Society has grown with the college, and its 1959 student membership totals approximately one hundred. Its former members are serving in positions of honor and responsibility in this country and abroad.

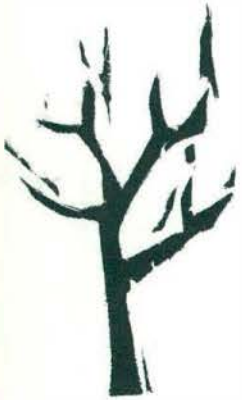

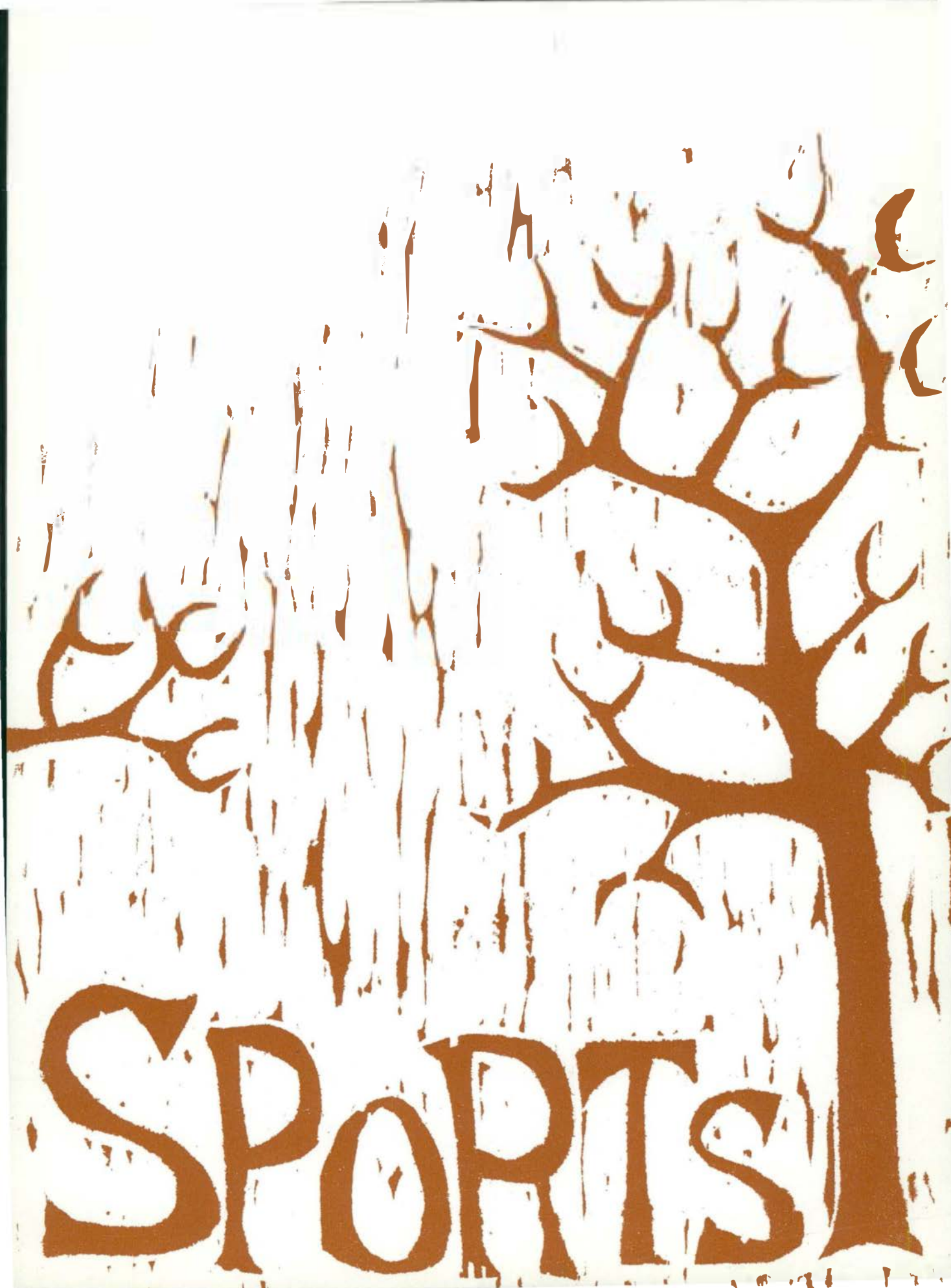

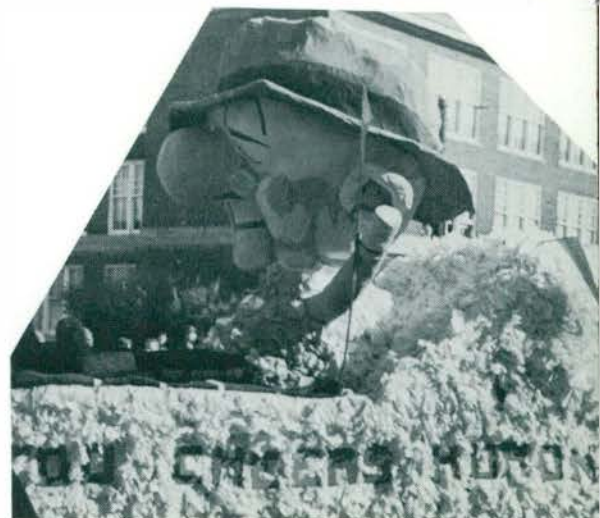

Eastern's "two-mile king," Gurney Beach ran perhaps the best race of his four-year career at EMC against Indiana in the spring of 1958. His 9:29 was considered a major factor in defeating the topnotch Hoosiers.



Hayes Jones, nationally recognized as one of the top three hurdlers in the country, was last year's indoor and outdoor national hurdling champion. For the second year in a row, Hayes tied the indoor sixty-yard high hurdles record, which he holds jointly with Milt Campbell, ex-Indiana hurdler, at :07 seconds flat. Hayes could generally be counted on to take from 15-20 points in any dual meet, and with his senior year yet to come. Huron fans may look for EMC's first true Olympic champion.



Captain Jim Robinson culminated his four year career at Eastern with an EMC pole vault record of 14 feet ½ inches, which was established at Bower Field House, February 28, in a triangular meet with Bowling Green University and the University of Detroit. This accomplishment makes him the second Michigan-born vaulter to cross the fourteen foot barrier.

Crack Huron half-miler, Doug Carroll, although hampered by lack of competition, has proved himself one of the top runners in his event in intrastate meets.

# This Season

With the stimulus of the new Quirk Dramatic Arts Building, theatre activity at Eastern increased in variety and scope during the 1958-59 season. New features included the sale of tickets on a subscription basis and a coffee-discussion hour after each play, sponsored by Alpha Psi Omega. More students participated actively than ever before in the EMC Players' program, and there was a marked increase in audience support.

In the fall of 1958, qualified Eastern Michigan College student directors presented a one-act play bill consisting of Edna St. Vincent Millay's "Aria da Capo," Thornton Wilder's "The Happy Journey to Trenton and Camden," and Sean O'Casey's "The End of the Beginning." This marked the farewell performance in the Roosevelt High School Auditorium, which served for several years as the home of EMC plays. Student directors for the three plays were David Meneghel, Ronald Muchnick, and Jerry Tewmey.

The gala opening of the Daniel L. Quirk, Jr. Dramatic Arts Building followed shortly thereafter. Its dedication production was a modern American drama, "The Crucible," by Arthur Miller. The first performance was presented on January 14, 1959.
