


#### THE NEW FOLK




#### CHRISTMAS SING

#### Military Ball




### BOARD OF REGENTS
























#### BASKETBALL




### STUDENT SENATE AND STUDENT COURT OFFER OPPORTUNITIES FOR RESPONSIBILITY




## CAMPUS SERVICE CORPS
