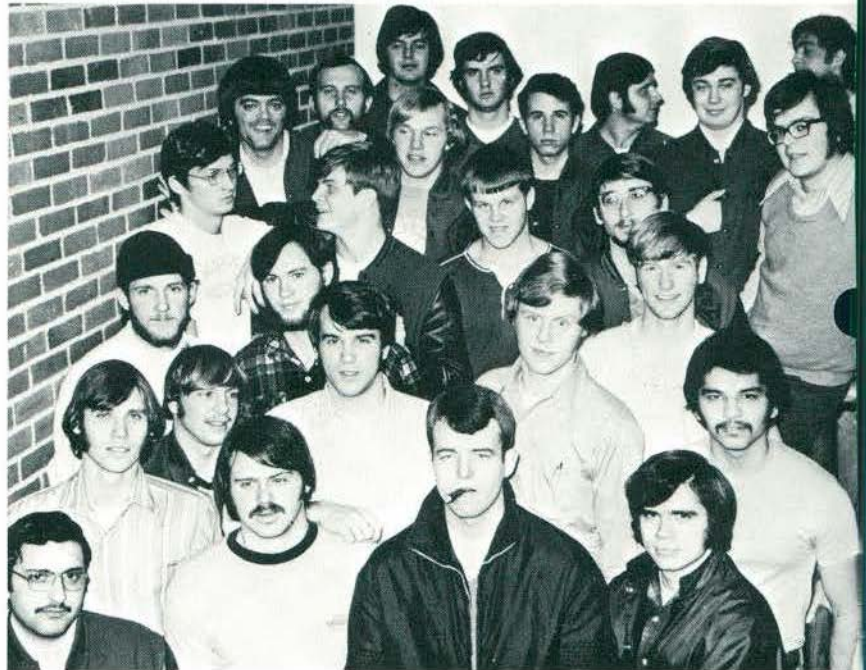




Arm of Honor

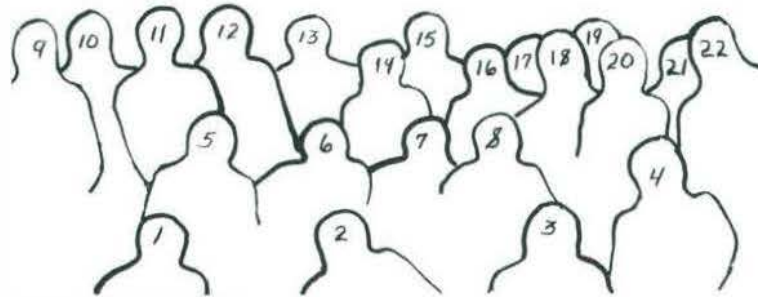




Alpha Xi Delta

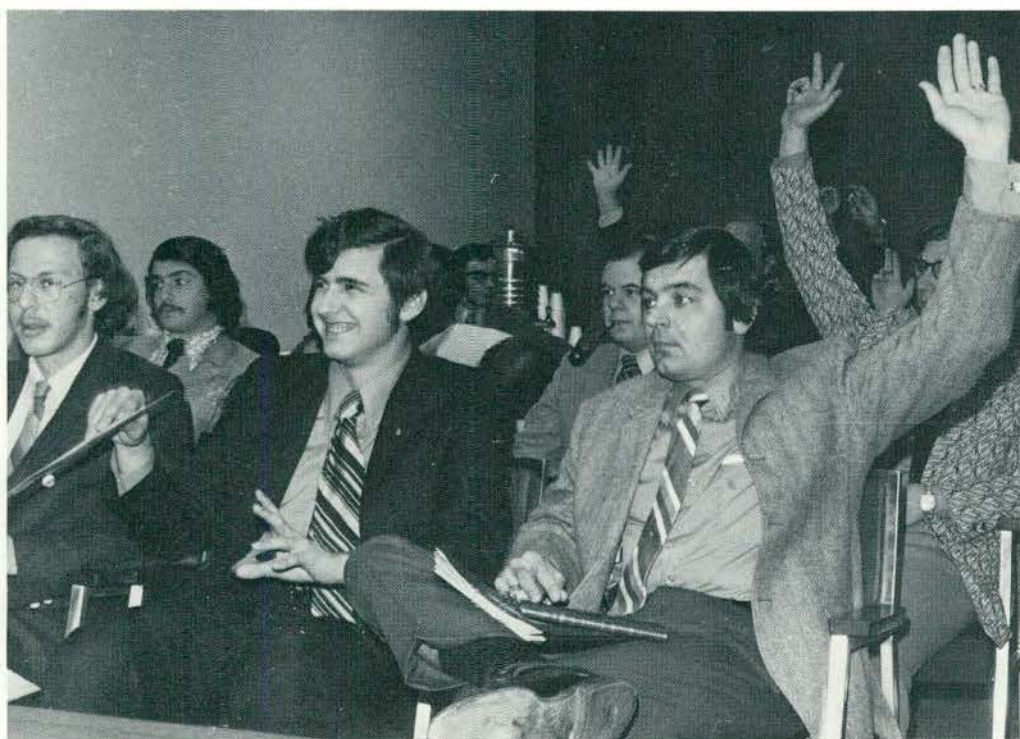

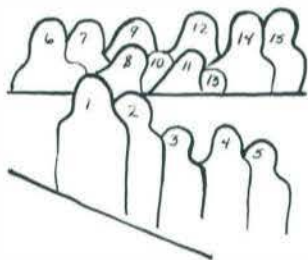

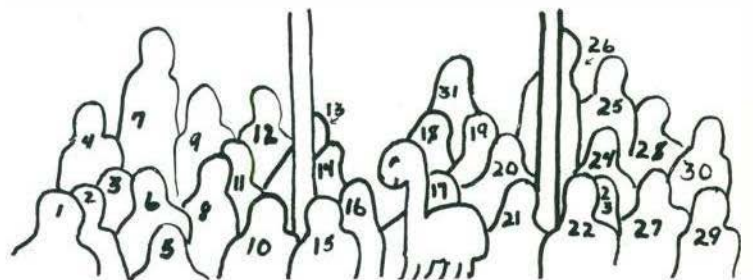
Sigma Nu Phi

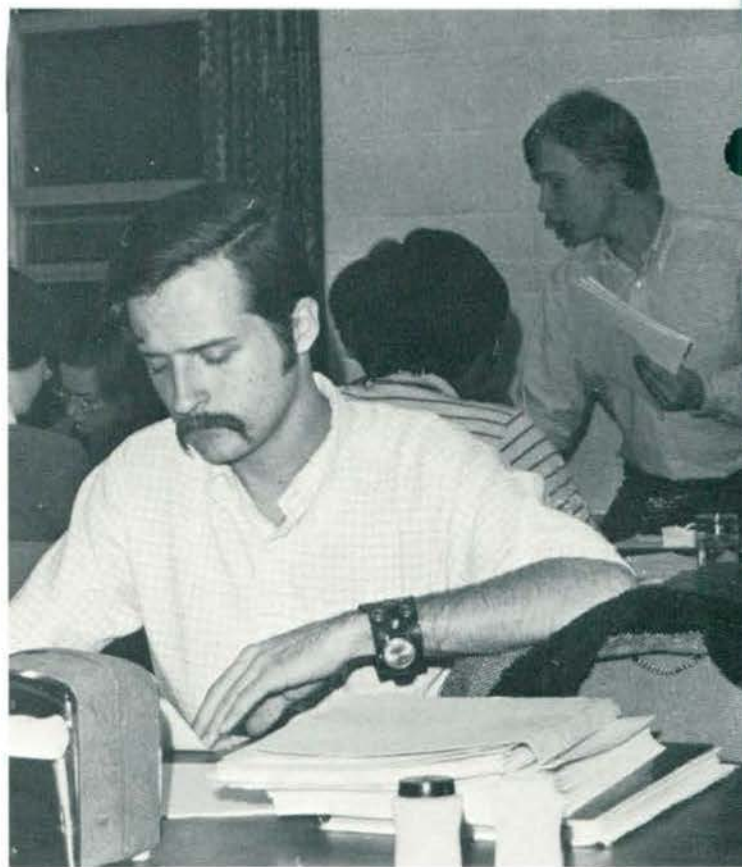


Residence Hall Assoc.

RHA has been involved in many of the decision making processes of the Housing Office. They have made specific recommendations concerning both food service and general housing conditions. Each dorm submitted a report on what their residents would like for next year and a special RHA committee was set up to take reports submitted by each dorm to the Housing Office.

RHA has also been involved in the question of minority affairs and has recommended that a minority affairs consultant be available to deal with these problems.

They have taken action concerning the change of certain existing policies in the Residence Halls. Two such policies are the painting of residents rooms and the pet policy. Reports from other Universities were gathered concerning these two policies and RHA worked from there, meeting with the Administration to solve these problems.

Student Senate

Unique in its priorities and direction, the Student Senate has provided the students with a revitalized Tenants Union, a Student Defenders Union and a Free University.

On campus, Student leaders were finally successful in "legalizing" the consumption of alcohol in the dorms while at the same time trying to improve the quality of life in the dormitories and encouraging more activities on weekends. Work is now being done for the abolishment of the men's swimming tests and activity hours requirements, changes in Instructor — Course Evaluation, re-evaluation of the tenure of faculty in order to increase the quality of education, and an academic statement of rights and responsibilities of faculty and students.

Focusing in on state politics and the young voter power, the Eastern delegation, as a major force, brought about the development of the Michigan Youth Caucus and a membership in the National Student Lobby. Eastern also served as the birthplace of the Michigan Higher Education Students Association, which serves as a student information center lobby in Lansing.

SOS Community Crisis Center

The S.O.S. distress calls from students have now been answered. S.O.S. Community Crisis Center receives over 1,200 calls a month from the University and Ypsilanti community. The calls range from homework difficulties, sex and dating hangups, pregnancies and contraceptive advice, to drug related problems.

Emergency needs are answered by the Flying Crisis Squad. Equipped with radios, they meet the needs of the bad "tripper", suicide attempts or threats, and runaway in minutes. The highly trained "O.D.
