

new paths in psychology


The department was pleased to announce this year that a new curriculum for Bachelor of Music in Performance, was initiated. The feelings are that this will attract many music-minded students into the University.



The department also prepared students for non-teaching jobs since a majority of graduates are now directing their energies toward government agencies and city planning jobs.

Each semester a new course was instructed by the departments' specialists, during fall semester professor Lawrence Ogden instructed Environmental Geology and, Medical Geology, during winter term, Andrew Nazzaro instructed.



Dr. Harold Sponberg resigned in the winter term of 1974 after eight years of vigorous administration as the President of Eastern Michigan University. During his administration many changes evolved on the face of the campus. On October 24, 1969, simultaneous dedication of Rynearson Stadium, Pray-Harrold, Mark Jefferson and Dorm Complex #3 (Towers) took place. Also under Sponberg the remodeling and reconstruction of McKenny Union, Quirk Theatre, Ford Hall, Roosevelt and Brown-Munson were completed. Total construction costs amounted to 48,099,419 dollars for 1,806,132 square feet of buildings. Eastern Michigan has seen, under Sponberg, The re-emergence of our athletic power — EMU teams won 16 national championships between 1966 and 1972. Scholastic improvement includes the addition of 27 new curriculum programs in all areas of study.



Let it be remembered that the 1973 Huron gridiron gladiators, setting new season records for points scored (265) and total offense with 3315 yards, provided plenty of excitement in battling to a 6-4 record.

Junior fullback Mike Strickland was again the Huron's running game with 1,105 yards. He also caught passes to account for 1,511 total yards and 9 touchdowns.

Senior quarterback, Frank Kolch and Houston Booth, along with senior receivers Reggie Garrett and Jim Grace, led an Eastern aerial show that was the best ever in EMU history; completing 120 of 253 passes for 1,779 yards and 20 touchdowns. Wide Receiver Reggie Garrett was sensational while grabbing 43 passes for 693 yards and 11 touchdowns, all season records. Co-captain Jim Grace showed people that Eastern still uses its tight end to catch passes, as he snatched 25 for 436 yards and 3 touchdowns.





Those in the men's division include a cross country meet, track, wrestling, golf, swimming as well as football, basketball, softball, bowling and tennis.


The women's division includes badminton, fencing, gymnastics and lacrosse, as well as softball, basketball and volleyball.

Co-ed teams also are represented in all the areas of action including waterpolo, football, softball and basketball.









Yet with less than one thousand minority people in the entire university system, the Office of Minority Affairs has its hands full fighting red tape and prejudices existing on campus.
